

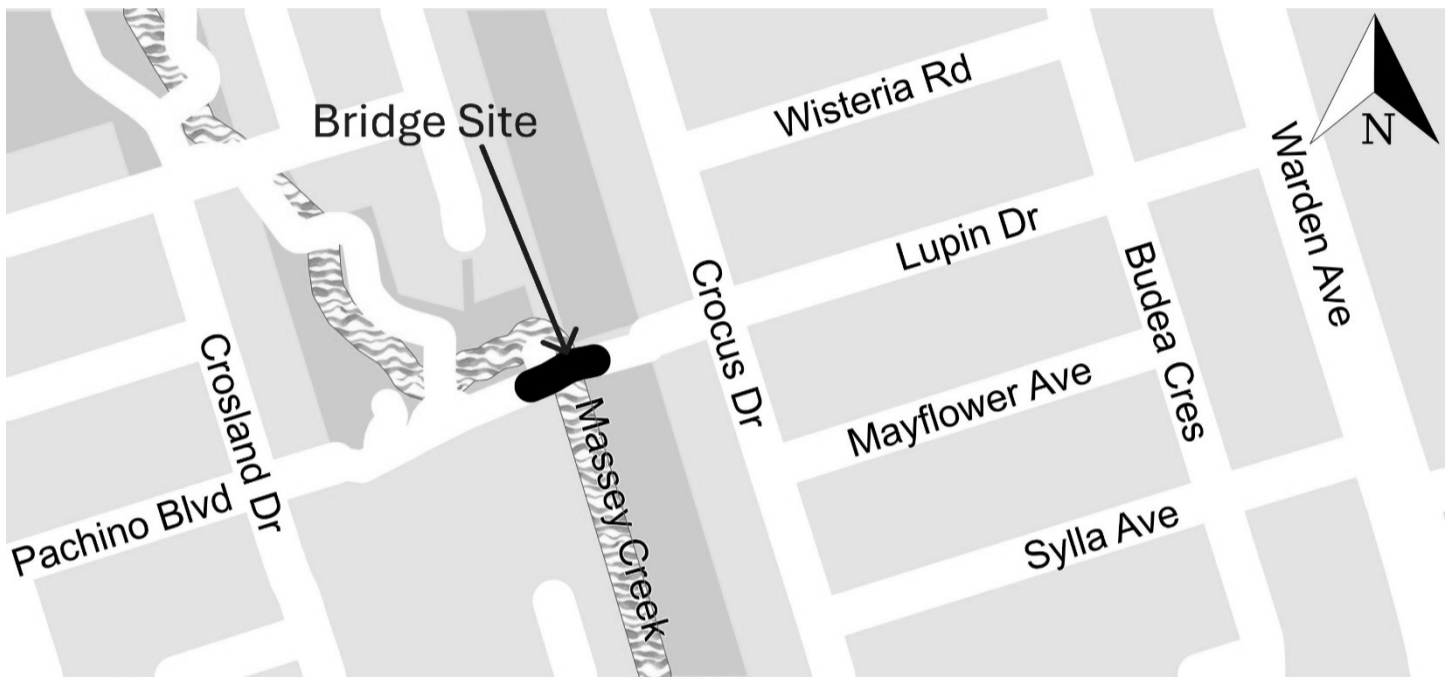

Lupin Drive Pedestrian Bridge Replacement over Taylor Massey Creek

Contract: 24ECS-BE-22SB
Start Date: June 29, 2026 End Date: September 2, 2026

The City of Toronto will replace the Lupin Drive Pedestrian bridge over Taylor Massey Creek. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today’s standards and remains safe for pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2026 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS




The City’s contractor will:

- Remove the existing superstructure of the Lupin Drive Pedestrian Bridge over Taylor Massey Creek.
- Widen the existing foundations and abutments to accommodate the wider bridge.
- Prefabricate, deliver and install the new bridge superstructure.
- Relocate the existing storm outfall at the SE corner of the bridge.
- Remove and replace asphalt approaches.
- Install approach fencing.
- Restore all areas disturbed by construction.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, the pedestrian bridge will be closed for the duration of construction from June 29, 2026 until September 2, 2026. Pedestrians and cyclists can use an alternate route to traverse the Hydro corridor and Taylor Massey Creek via Crocus Drive/Cavehill Crescent to the North, and Japonica Road to the south.</p>

	<p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Project Manager listed below.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
