## Stream Rehabilitation of Morningside Creek South of Casebridge Outfall

**Contract: 25ECS-LU-03SM**

**Expected Start Date: June 25, 2026 | Expected End Date: December 31, 2026**

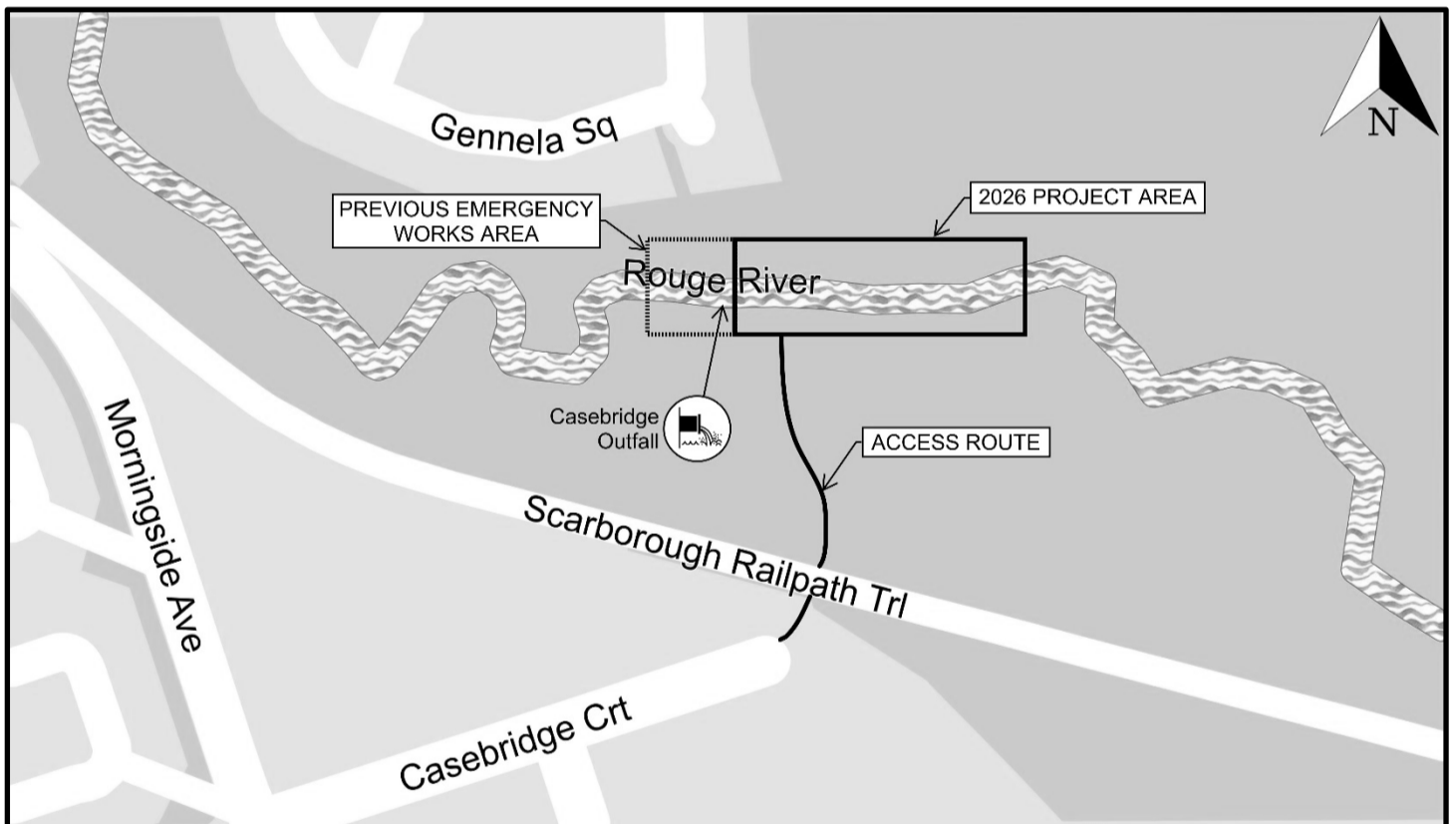

The City of Toronto will restore a 110-metre section of Morningside Creek, a tributary to the Rouge River, that has been damaged by ongoing erosion and extreme rainfall events. The project area is located north of Casebridge Court and east of Morningside Avenue. Previous emergency works were undertaken in 2014 to provide immediate protection upstream, including repairs to the Casebridge Outfall. This initiative is intended to rehabilitate the remaining area downstream of the outfall to ensure its long-term stability and ecological health.

Work will involve installing erosion protection and in-water habitat enhancement measures. The adjacent floodplain, as well as all areas disturbed by construction, will be enriched through native riparian plantings to improve the local valley ecosystem.

The project is part of the Council-approved 2026 Capital Works Program.





The City's contractor will:

- Use an existing access path from Casebridge Court to access the work area as shown on the map and manage all construction vehicle movements to ensure construction vehicles enter and exit safely with minimal disruption to surrounding trail users and pedestrians.
- Install site safety fencing, tree protection barriers, and erosion and sediment controls to prevent silt and mud from flowing into the watercourse, trail, or street.
- Work within Morningside Creek to install erosion mitigation measures to provide long-term erosion protection and improve aquatic habitat in the watercourse.
- Rehabilitate all access routes and staging areas during the demobilization phase.

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work is anticipated to take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure accessible walkways and entryways are safe and maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Project Manager listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Access to Your Property:</b> The City-hired contractor may need access to your property to complete a pre-construction survey. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all property owners to participate as the results may be useful to confirm claims for potential damage caused by City construction.</p> <p>Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.</p>
	<p><b>Site Safety:</b> Workers on site are responsible for the work assigned to them. If you have construction questions or an issue on site – ask to be directed to the Site Inspector. If the Site Inspector is unavailable, contact the person listed at the end of this notice.</p>
	<p><b>On-Site Communication:</b> There are times when contractors may need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about site access, pre-construction inspections or short-term trail closures. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p>
	<p><b>Intermittent Cycling Path Disruption:</b> The Scarborough Railpath Trail will remain open during construction. However, construction vehicles and equipment will occasionally cross the Scarborough Railpath Trail for mobilization, demobilization, deliveries, and disposals. Flagpersons will escort vehicles and equipment at all times and provide traffic control for cyclist and pedestrians.</p>
