Basement Flooding Protection Program Fairbank-Silverthorn Storm Sewer System - Phase 2 Construction on Ronald Avenue

Contract #: 23ECS-MI-02FS

Start Date: May 18, 2026

This notice is an update to the [construction notice](#) for Ronald Avenue that was distributed on **May 11, 2026**. Please visit [Toronto.ca/fairbank](https://toronto.ca/fairbank) for further information.

The City of Toronto is advancing construction of a new storm sewer system that will collect, store and move stormwater (rain and melted snow) from the Fairbank-Silverthorn area to Black Creek. This work is part of the City's Basement Flooding Protection Program to help reduce the risk of future basement flooding. Once complete, the new storm sewer system will help to reduce the impact of heavy rainfall and sewer back-ups for more than 4,600 homes in your area.

The City's contractor commenced Phase 1 of the storm sewer work along Ronald Avenue, starting from Bowie Ave and working north to Castlefield Avenue. **As work approaches the intersection of Ronald Avenue and Castlefield Avenue, the intersection will be closed.** The following traffic restrictions will apply during this work (Refer to the maps on page 3 and 4):

- The traffic restrictions are limited to work within the Ronald Avenue and Castlefield Avenue intersection and are expected to be in effect from **June 22 to July 6, 2026**, weather permitting. The contractor will work from **7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on weekdays and Saturdays** to expedite the work.
 - During Phase 1a, traffic will not be permitted through the intersection. Traffic will only be maintained between #137 to #111 Ronald Avenue. Phase 1a will remain in effect for approximately seven (7) calendar days.
 - During Phase 1b, traffic will not be permitted through the intersection. Traffic will only be maintained between #137 to #111 Ronald Avenue. Phase 1b will remain in effect for approximately seven (7) calendar days.
- Detours signs will be deployed to accommodate traffic.
- Access to businesses on Ronald Avenue will be maintained from the south via Eglinton Avenue West.

Generally, the following traffic restrictions will apply during construction:

- Construction on Ronald Avenue will be done through rolling closures in block-by-block sequencing. Each block will be limited to local traffic during construction.
- Driveways may be affected on Ronald Avenue. If your driveway is affected, a separate driveway notice will be submitted at least 48 hours before works take place.
- Sidewalks on both sides will remain open for the duration of construction. Pedestrian access to properties will be maintained at all times.

The project is part of the Council-approved 2021 [Basement Flooding Protection Program](#) and is partially funded by the Government of Canada. The Government of Canada has committed \$73.2 million in funding for this project through the [Disaster Mitigation and Adaptation Fund](#), a Canada-wide program to support large-scale infrastructure projects and help communities better manage the risks of disasters triggered by natural hazards. The City of Toronto is providing the remaining estimated funding of \$310 million.

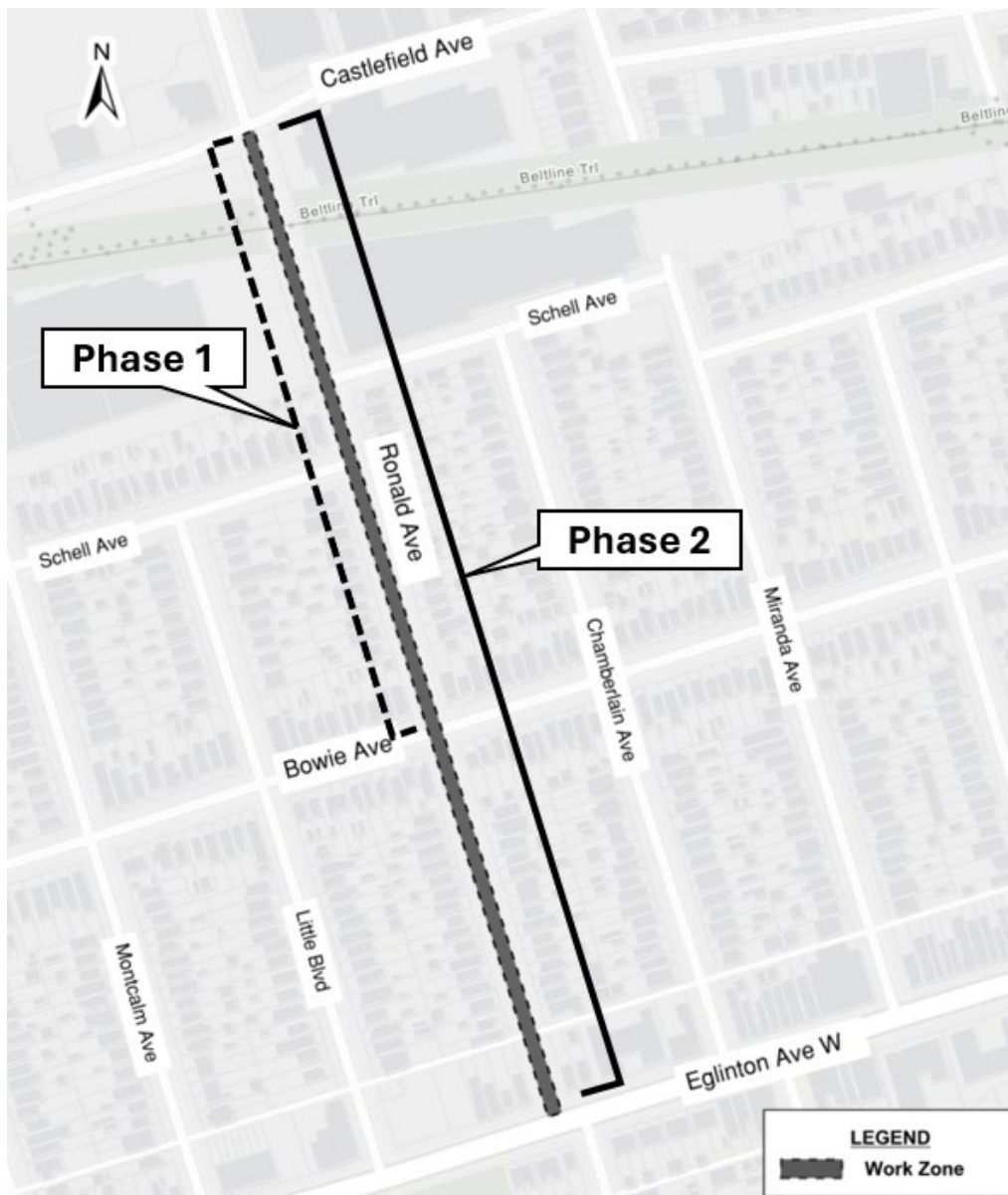
WORK DETAILS

- Excavate the road and dig a trench.
- Install new storm sewers and watermains.
- Resurface the road upon completion.

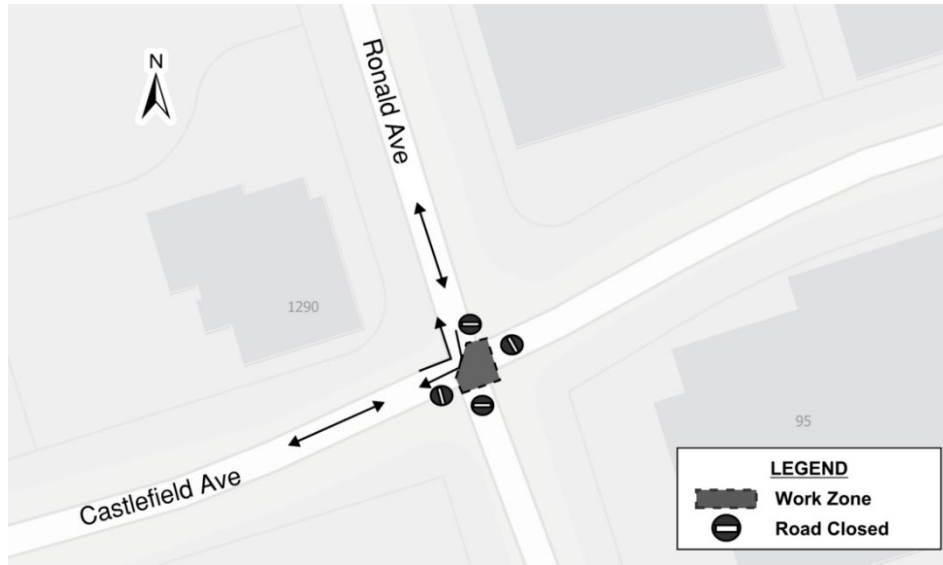
MAP OF WORK AREA

Construction Work Area on Ronald Avenue

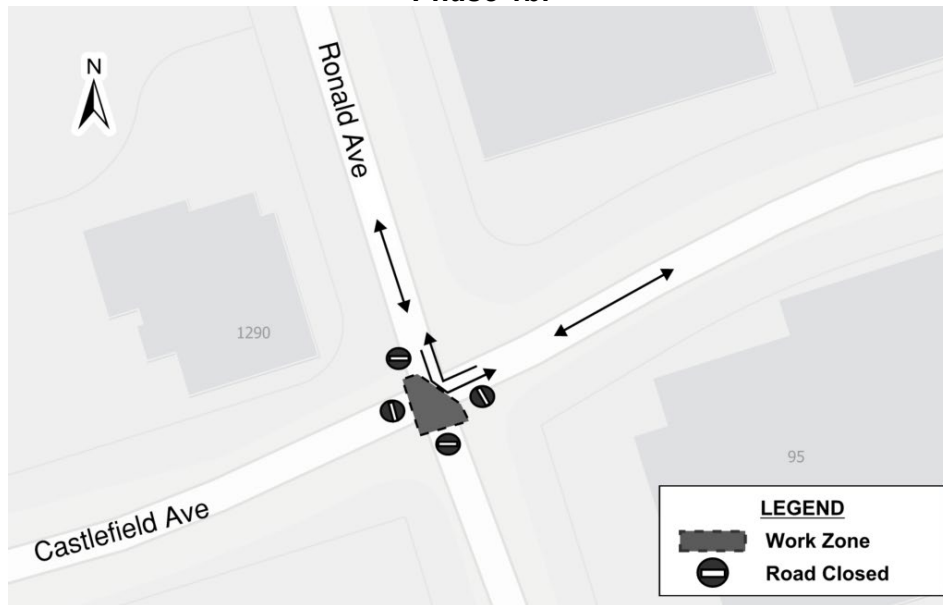


Construction Work Area at the intersection of Ronald Avenue and Castlefield Avenue

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property, so please ensure that you remove/arrange for removal of each item prior to construction.



Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

	<p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p>
	<p>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems/heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage. This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. For details on removal of such items, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p>Road Closure: During construction, Ronald Avenue will be closed and limited to local traffic only. Parking where required will be on adjacent streets. Vehicular parking on Ronald Avenue during each phase will be prohibited during the working hours of 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Vehicles left unattended will be subject to “friendly towing.” Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Sidewalk Access: Sidewalks on both sides will remain open for the duration of construction. Pedestrian access to properties will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: Your driveway may be affected during construction. Please note that you will be notified with a separate notice that specified the duration of the driveway impact if applicable.</p> <p>Street Parking: Street parking will not be available during construction. Arrangements for alternate street parking should be considered.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby side streets. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p>
	<p>Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Contact the Field Ambassador listed below, and provide a photo of your ticket and ticket number, along with your contact information or 2. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or

	<p>3. File a Parking Violation Dispute online, by mail or in person (follow instructions on the back of the violation notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction</p> <p>If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.</p> <p>Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e., in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).</p> <p>In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.</p>
	<p>Accessibility Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p>Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that your bins are labelled with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Full restoration will be completed by the contractor.</p>
