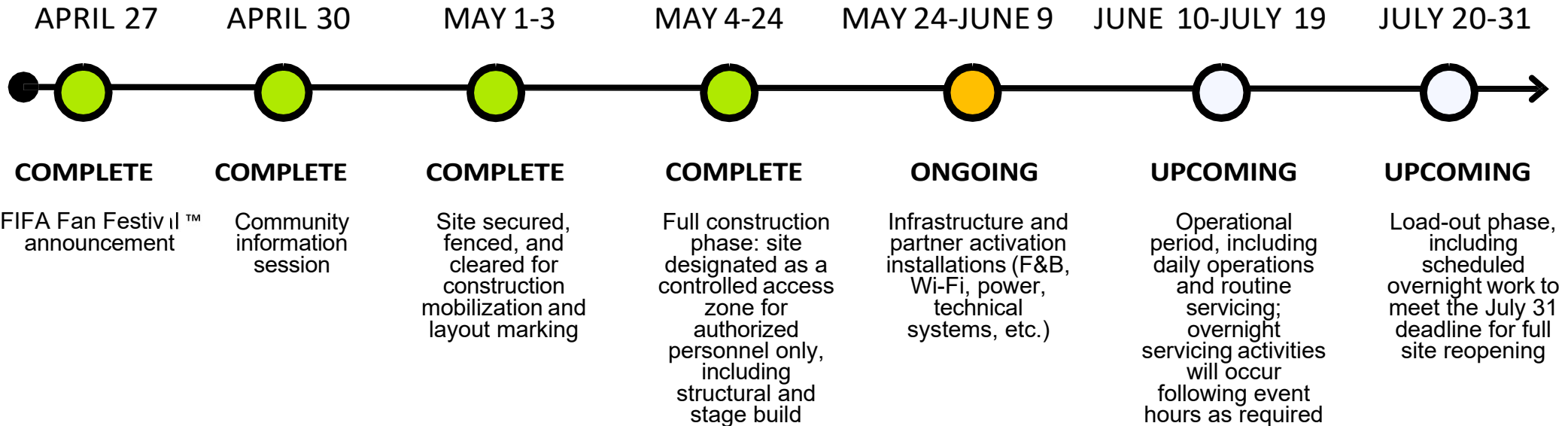

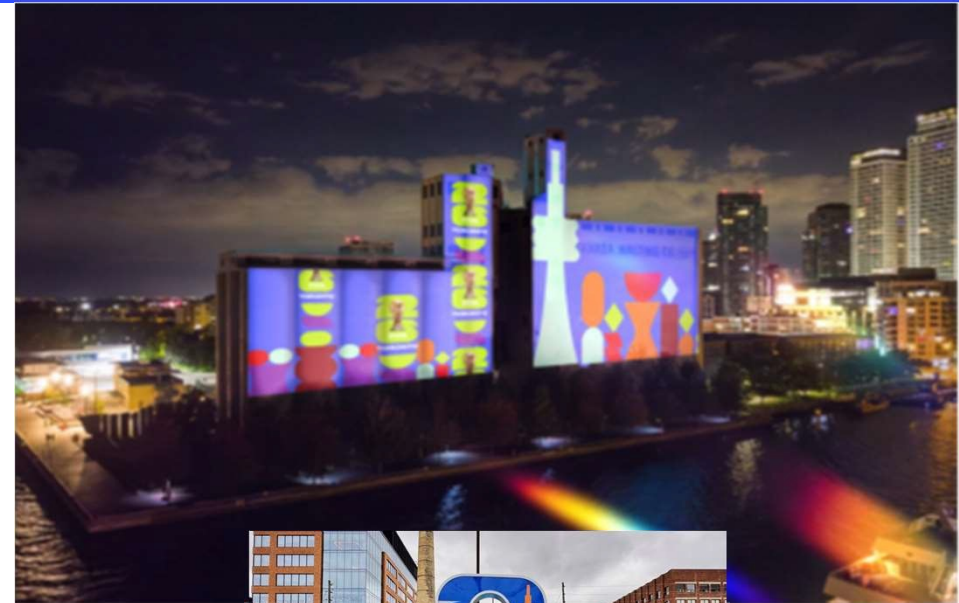

Solid Waste Management Services - Core Services Offered Throughout the Games



- **Manual Cleaning (Bag & Broom):** Sidewalks, laneways, and public spaces cleaned **7 days per week, up to 16 hours per day** to maintain continuous surface cleanliness.
- **Mechanical Cleaning (Litter Vacuums):** Debris removal along priority corridors, **operating daily beginning at 4:00 a.m.**
- **Fly Operations:** Mobile response teams addressing litter hotspots, illegal dumping, and service requests, **operating 7 days per week up to 16 hours per day, increasing to 24-hour coverage on match days.**
- **Street Litter Bin Servicing:** Servicing of street litter bins within the FIFA footprint with **increased collection frequency, operating 7 days per week with extended coverage up to 20 hours per day.**
- **Park Bin Servicing:** Servicing of waste and recycling bins within priority parks, with **increased frequency and supplemental coverage on match days.**



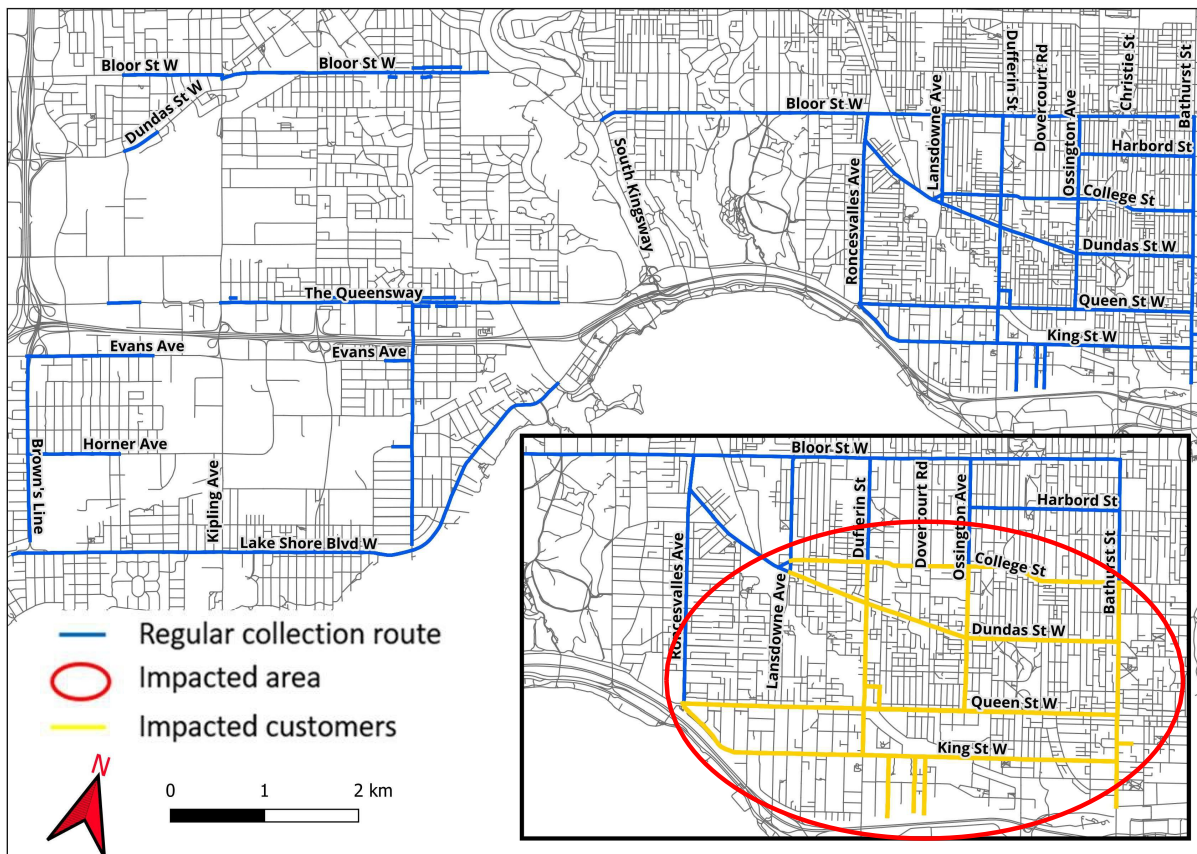
Garbage & Waste Management - One Time Change Night Collections



Overview of One-Time Night Collection Schedule Change

- The City of Toronto will host multiple matches as part of the FIFA World Cup 2026™ from June 12, 2026 to July 2, 2026 with final City of Toronto match on Thursday, July 2, 2026.
- The event is expected to generate significant pedestrian activity within designated “last mile” zones and expanded last mile footprint.
- To maintain cleanliness, safety, and service levels and support a positive visitor and resident experience Solid Waste Management Services will make a one-time collection change for customers in the impacted area. Discussions with Circular Materials currently underway to reflect the change for recycling for eligible customers.
- **One-time night collection schedule change:** Thursday July 2, 2026 moved to Wednesday July 1, 2026
- **Total Impacted Customers:** 2698; 836 of those in Ward 10

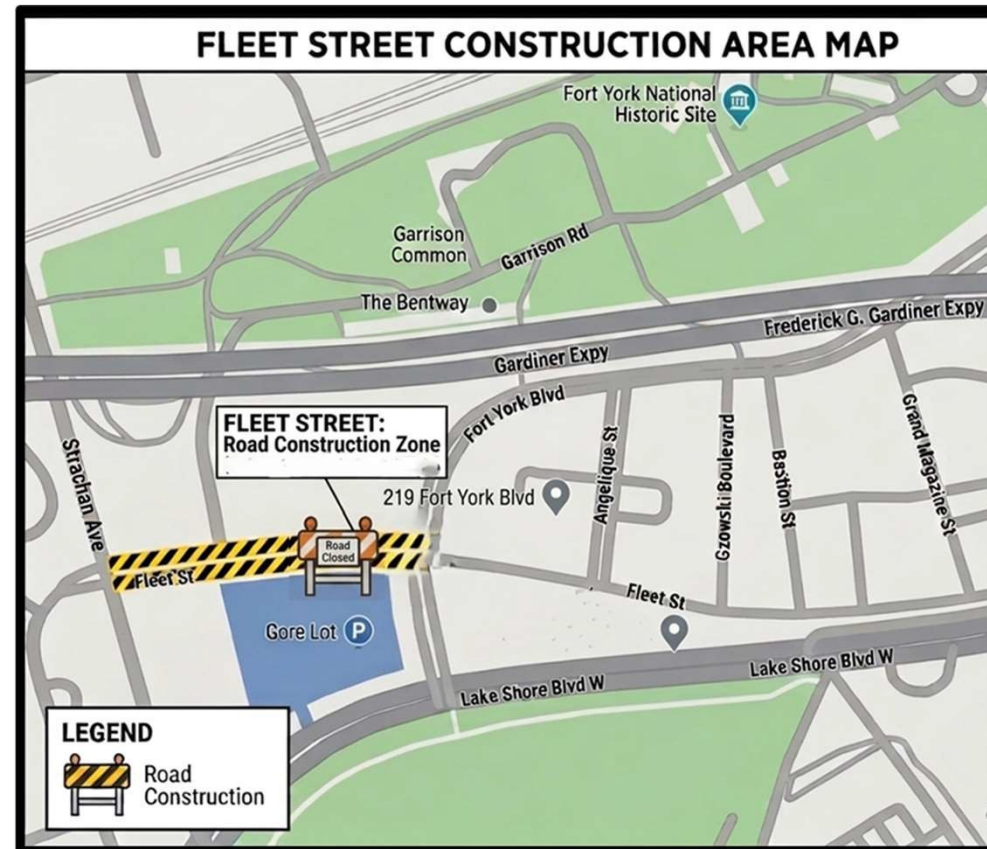

Fleet Street Construction Update



- Fleet Street Hub construction began May 19
- Construction scheduled to be complete June 5 followed by a period of TTC testing
- Fleet Street transit hub will be operational on June 10
- Platform removal scheduled for July 25 – 31



Travel Demand Management (TDM) Measures

509 Harbourfront streetcar	Increased service: every 5 minutes at most times of day, every day, from June 7 to July 24.	Overnight streetcar service will be added on a 20-minute frequency from June 7 to July 12.
504 King streetcar	Increased service: every 5 minutes at most times of day, every day, from June 7 to July 24.	Ongoing work with the City and Toronto Police Services on enhanced priority measures to keep service moving.

- The Fleet Street Transit Hub (currently under construction) will be the last stop for customers traveling on either the **509 Harbourfront streetcar** or **511 Bathurst streetcar** heading to Toronto Stadium and/or FIFA Fan Festival™ Toronto.
- Exhibition Loop and the stops at Manitoba Street and Strachan Avenue will be closed to customers.
- Customers who require accessible assistance to continue their journey further west beyond the Fleet Street Transit Hub can remain on board a **509 Harbourfront** or **511 Bathurst streetcar** to reach their destination.

Match Days: Post-match

- Eastbound **509 Harbourfront streetcars** will temporarily bypass stops between the Fleet Street Transit Hub and Bathurst Street/Queens Quay (Billy Bishop Airport).
- Northbound **511 Bathurst streetcars** will temporarily bypass stops between the Fleet Street Transit Hub and King Street West.

June 7 - July 24

510 Spadina streetcars will turn back at Spadina Avenue and Queens Quay and will not serve Union Station. Customers can transfer to a **509 Harbourfront streetcar** at Spadina Avenue and Queens Quay to reach Union Station. Increased **509 Harbourfront streetcar** service will help customers with this transfer.

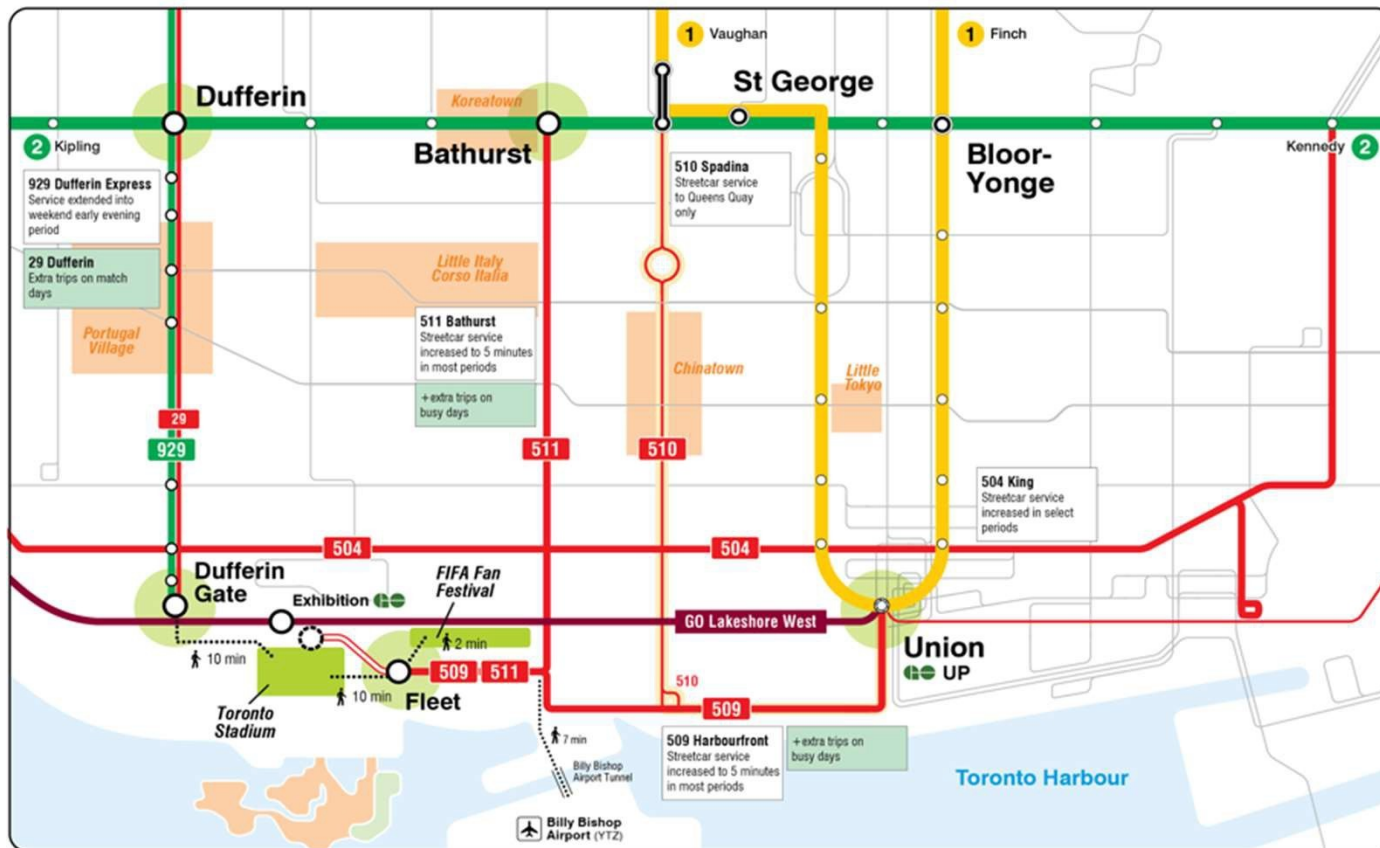

Accessibility



In May 2026, the TTC mailed a Transit Notice to residents in Liberty Village and Fort York outlining planned service changes and enhancements for the FIFA World Cup 2026™, including the temporary removal of certain stops during the tournament.

The notice also detailed how customers who require accessible assistance and may be affected by these changes can apply for Wheel-Trans service.

Customers can apply for Wheel-Trans in several ways:

NAVIGATING THE NEIGHBOURHOOD

EXHIBITION GO STATION

The station will be open **only** to GO customers on FIFA World Cup 2026™ match days.

WAYFINDING

City of Toronto wayfinding will be up along East Liberty Street and other local roads to help pedestrians and drivers navigate around the station.

PLANNING AHEAD

If your schedule allows, consider adjusting your travel time or choosing an alternative option to avoid the peak crowd on match days.

SERVICE AND SAFETY

During the tournament, Lakeshore West and East line trains will run **every 15 minutes** for most of the day, starting June 10, with even more service on match days.

We'll have **wayfinding signage** at Exhibition Station to guide you to the events and back.

We'll have **additional staff** and volunteers at busy stations across the GO network, including Exhibition, to help manage large crowds and keep our stations and platforms moving safely.

Local Access Only



- During Match days – many streets in Liberty Village and Fort York will be restricted to Local Access Only.
- Residents + businesses will be eligible to receive a Local Access Permit which will facilitate easy access into these areas.
- Police will be given guidance on looking for these resident permits as vehicles approach these areas.
- These are not parking permits and will not entitle those with permits to parking.

Passes: Residents + Businesses



- City staff have connected with all condos in the neighbourhood and received numbers from each.
- Precinct BIAs have engaged with businesses to get a count of number of passes needed for their employees.
- Passes are numbered to mitigate against duplication.
- Passes distributed via condo management to residents; passes distributed via precinct BIAs for employees of businesses in the Ward.

Access: Deliveries, Rideshare and Taxi



- Deliveries will continue to be allowed, but to the extent possible if they can be arranged outside of road closure periods it will help mitigate congestion.
- Local Access Only restrictions within Fort York will be limited to +1/-1hr from when FIFA Fan Festival gates are open.
- Additional pick-up/drop-off area for rideshare will be added on Stadium Rd for non-match days while FIFA Fan Festival is active.
- Drop-offs for the Stadium and FIFA Fan Festival will be directed to the designated areas at Lamport Stadium, Douro, Front Street and Stadium Rd.
- Pick-ups for Wheeltrans and accessible taxis will continue to be permitted at all times, however rideshare pick-ups will be subject to geofencing during active hours.

Access: School Busses



- School busses will be permitted to enter local access zones to provide continuity of service for student pick-up and drop-off.
- Ministry of Education is the lead organization providing information to School Boards, Principals and Administrators and then through to parents.

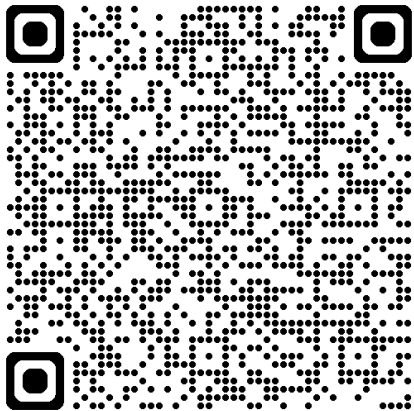
