Dupont Street Bridge Rehabilitation under Metrolinx Rail

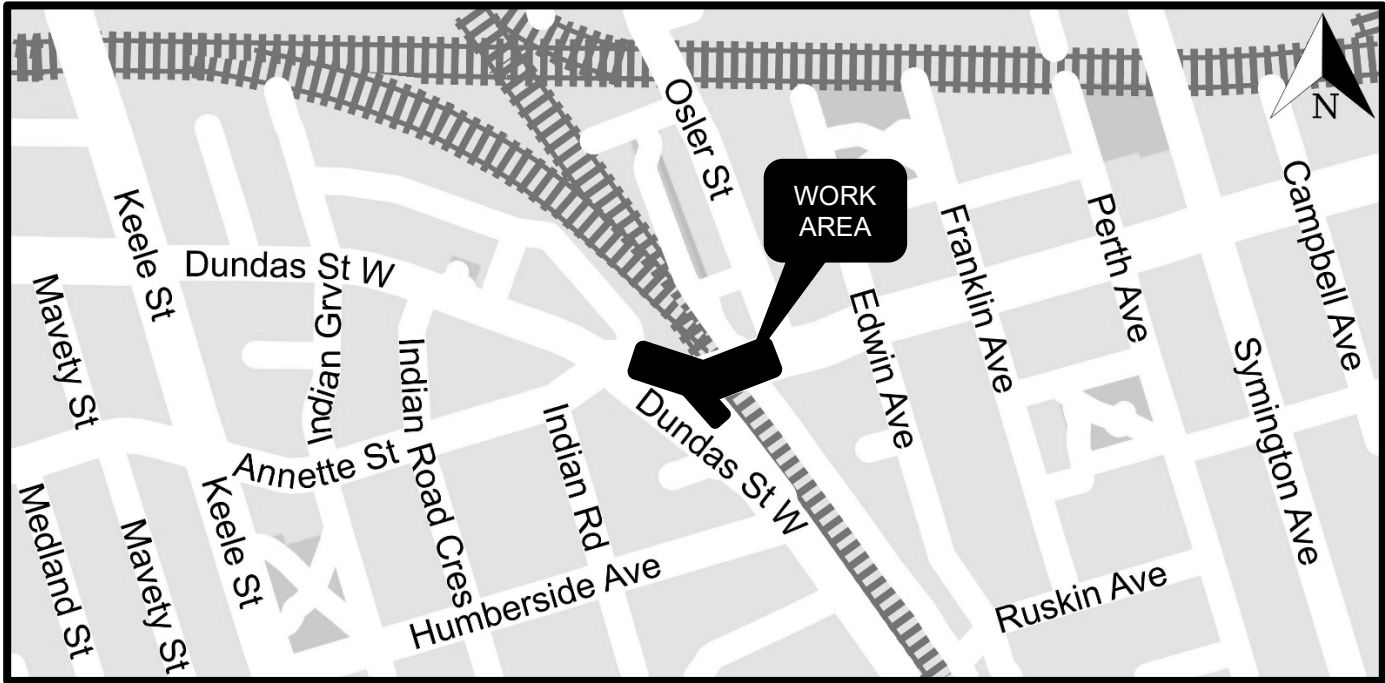

This notice provides an update on the rehabilitation of the Dupont Street Bridge under Metrolinx rail.

Work on this project is expected to resume on July 13, 2026 and continue for approximately three (3) weeks to complete remaining concrete surface sealing, install pier crash protection systems, and resurface the roadway within bridge limits.

We appreciate residents and businesses for their patience as we complete the final phase of this important project.

WORK COMPLETED TO DATE

To date, the following work has been completed:

- Patch repairs and reconstruction of concrete sidewalks, retaining walls, and new railings
- Replacement of bird screens, electrical conduits, and streetlighting
- Cleaning and coating of structural steel including removal of timber decking and installation of new concrete deck and asphalt surface on the West Toronto Railpath pedestrian bridge over Dupont Street

REMAINING WORK

In the next few weeks, the City’s contractor will be completing the following work:

- Completion of structural concrete surface sealing
- Installation of energy attenuators or permanent pier crash protection systems
- Roadway resurfacing near the bridge on Dupont Street and a portion of Dundas Street West, including asphalt milling and pavement markings

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. During construction there will be lane closures on Dupont Street and Dundas Street West from Edwin Avenue to Annette Street and Brad Street. Paid duty officers will be on site as required to direct traffic and manage daily lane closures, with at least one lane maintained in each direction at all times.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work safely, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions, however any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction. At least one sidewalk will remain open at all times, and paid duty officers may assist pedestrians through the work zone when sidewalk closures are in effect.
	People Cycling: Travel will be reduced to one shared lane in each direction for people cycling and driving through the work zone.
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
