New Sidewalk Construction, Road Reconstruction, Road Resurfacing, and Watermain Decommissioning on Wilby Crescent from Weston Road to Hickory Tree Road

Contract: 25ECS-RD-104LR

Start Date: Saturday November 29, 2025 | End Date: July 31, 2026

**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto is building a new sidewalk on the west side of Wilby Crescent, from Weston Road to Hickory Tree Road, to improve safety and accessibility for all road users. Creating space for the new sidewalk requires adjustments to nearby underground and surface infrastructure so the sidewalk meets current standards, drains properly and does not interfere with water or utility services.

As part of this work, the following elements will be modified or relocated:

- The City-owned portions of water service pipes that do not meet City standards
- Installation of one new fire hydrant
- Removal of existing fire hydrant
- Realignment of one catch basin and one maintenance hole
- Installation of new curbs and gutters
- Decommissioning an old watermain

As work cannot be completed during cold weather, construction will pause for a winter break on **December 19, 2025**.

Work taking place between Nov. 29 to Dec. 19, 2025

- Sidewalk excavation, framing and pouring concrete
- Relocation of underground infrastructure, including hydrant and catch basin
- Curb and gutter installation
- Temporary restoration of the work area for safe winter conditions
- **The new sidewalk is expected to be open and usable by December 19, 2025**

Spring 2026 work restarts

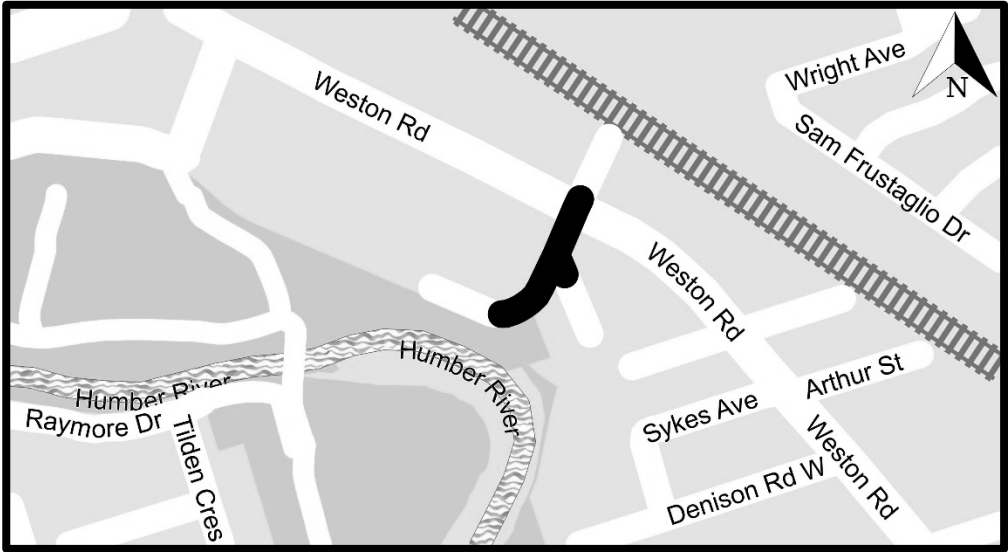
- Construction will resume in April 2026, or once weather conditions allow and will include:
- Water service installation and decommissioning of an old unused portion of the watermain
- Full road reconstruction on the west side and partial road resurfacing on the east side

Installing a new sidewalk is one way the City is committed to making the community safer and more accessible. This project is part of the Council-approved 2025 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD WATER SERVICES

If you live on Wilby Crescent in the area described above in a house that was built before the mid-1950s, your water service may be made of lead. Please read the attached fact sheet with important information about the risks of lead in drinking water, especially if someone in your house is pregnant, there are children under six years old, or there is an infant drinking formula made using tap water.

WORK DETAILS

- The City’s contractor will:
- Install new sidewalk, curb and gutter
 - Decommission a watermain
 - Replace any City-owned water service pipes that do not meet City standards from the watermain to the private property line
 - Re-align maintenance holes and catch basins
 - Reconstruct and resurface the road

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Pre-Construction Inspection: Wristen’s Home Specialties Inc. (WHS), under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. The inspection will look at the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all homeowners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.
	Site Safety: Workers on site are responsible for the work assigned to them. If you have construction questions or an issue on site – ask to be directed to the Site Inspector. If the Site Inspector is unavailable, contact the person listed at the end of this notice.
	Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage. This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below.

	Telephone and Internet Services: This work may affect phone and internet cables for individual properties that aren't buried deep below the sidewalk. The contractor will coordinate with utility companies to minimize disruption. Residents who find their service has been disrupted should contact the Field Ambassador <u>and</u> notify their phone or internet service provider.
	City Owned Trees: The City makes an effort to minimize the number of trees that are impacted by construction, however, to carry out this project 2 trees will need to be removed. The City plants three trees for every one tree that is removed. After construction is completed, new trees will be planted on streets where there is sufficient space in the boulevard, in parks and ravine areas.
	Water Service Disruptions: From time-to-time, the water supply to your property will be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide notice at least 24-hours in advance. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to water manually. In the event you did not receive advance notice, the City may have needed to use an emergency water shut off to complete work.
	Substandard Water Service Replacement: Please take the time to read the attached fact sheet carefully as it contains important information on lead in drinking water and how to prepare for replacement. If you want to replace the private portion-of the water service pipe, the City of Toronto recommends that you obtain several quotes before selecting a contractor. PLEASE NOTE: The City is not able to get involved in any contract to have work done on private property. Property owners are responsible for ensuring contractors do not interfere with the work being done on City property. Learn more at www.toronto.ca/leadpipes.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. • Local traffic restrictions are expected, and traffic control will be maintained with flag personnel. • traffic within the project limits may be reduced to one lane during construction.
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment: 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute

	process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy. Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones). In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
	Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
	Water Flushing: You will see water flushing or running in several areas along this project due to cleaning the new watermain. Before substandard water services are replaced and the new watermain is put into service, the new pipe must meet Toronto Water's servicing and quality standards. Please DO NOT DRINK OR USE THE FLUSHING WATER, it is not potable.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - April to June and September to October.
