

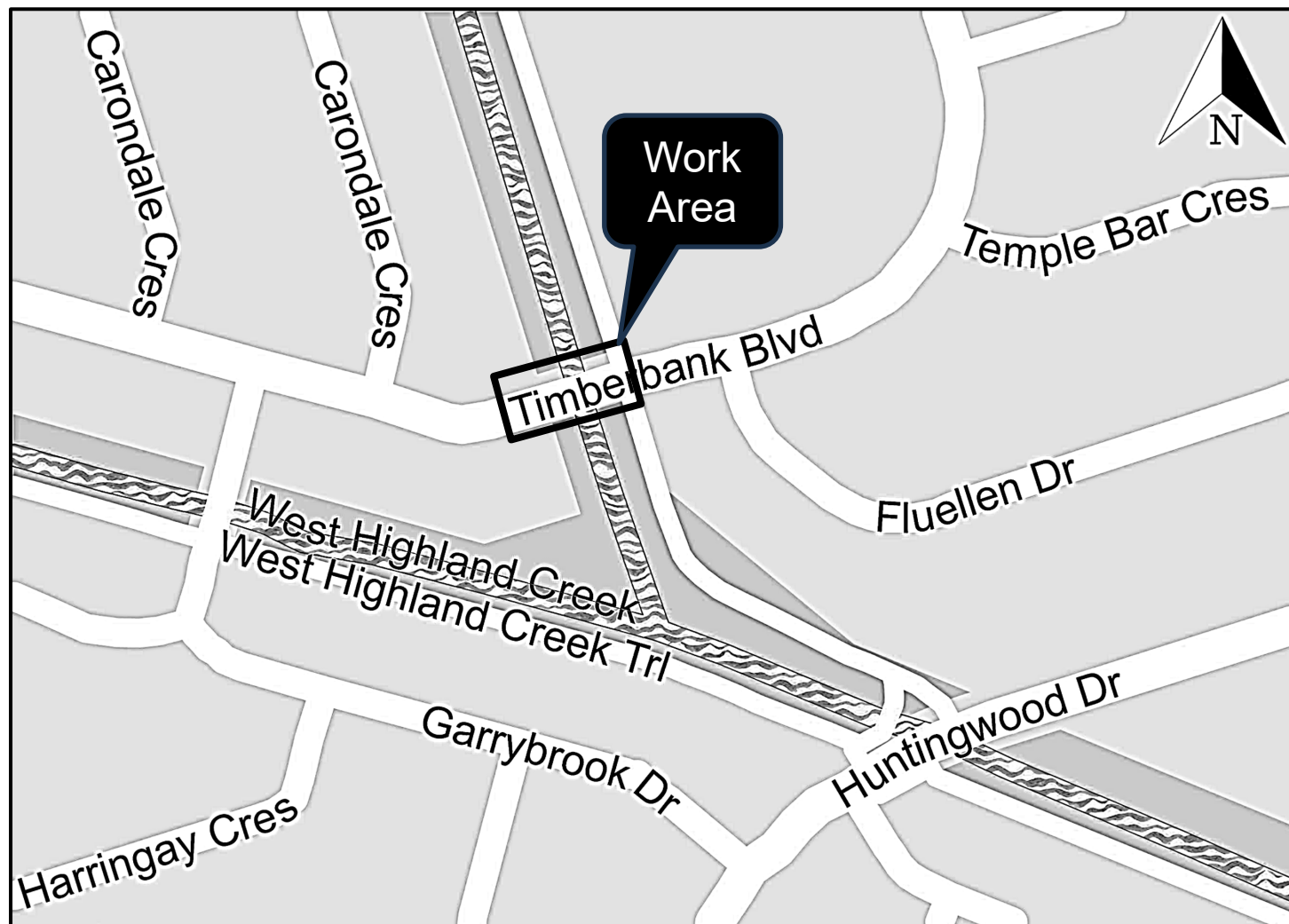

Timberbank Boulevard Culvert Replacement over West Highland Creek

Contract: 26ECS-BE-07PM
 Start Date: August 2026 End Date: Spring 2027

The City of Toronto is planning to replace the Timberbank Boulevard Culvert over West Highland Creek. This work will ensure that the culvert meets today’s standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2026 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS

- The City’s contractor will:
- Replace the existing CSP culvert with a twin span precast concrete box culvert
 - Replace the existing steel retaining walls with cast-in-place concrete retaining walls
 - Install ground improvements to increase the bearing capacity of the soils
 - Installation of an access ramp for ground improvement and culvert replacement
 - Installation of a temporary bypass pipe through the existing culvert
 - Roadway reconstruction and site restoration including sidewalk, boulevard, asphalt pavement and steel beam guide rails within the proposed work area

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Pre-Construction Inspection: The Contractor, under contract to the City of Toronto, is conducting inspections of properties in the vicinity of the construction area before construction starts. Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment for the inspection. The inspection will look at the exterior and interior of properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all property owners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Timberbank Boulevard will be closed to traffic at the work site for the duration of construction. No through traffic will be permitted. Motorists are encouraged to follow the posted detours signs for alternative road access. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout construction with one sidewalk opened at all times. Pedestrians may be required to cross the road at the nearest crosswalk to access the open sidewalk during construction. To maintain pedestrian access during construction, a temporary pedestrian bridge will be installed.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
