Combined Sewer Replacement & TTC Track Renewal on College Street/Carlton Street from Bay Street to Church Street

Contract: 26ECS-RD-04SW

Start Date: Early March 2026 End Date: December 2026

**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto is replacing the combined sewer and combined service lateral pipes on College Street from Yonge Street to Bay Street. The City of Toronto and Toronto Transit Commission are renewing the TTC tracks on College Street/Carlton Street from Bay Street to Church Street. The City's contractor has finished track replacement at the intersection of Bay Street and College Street and will return to complete the remaining work.

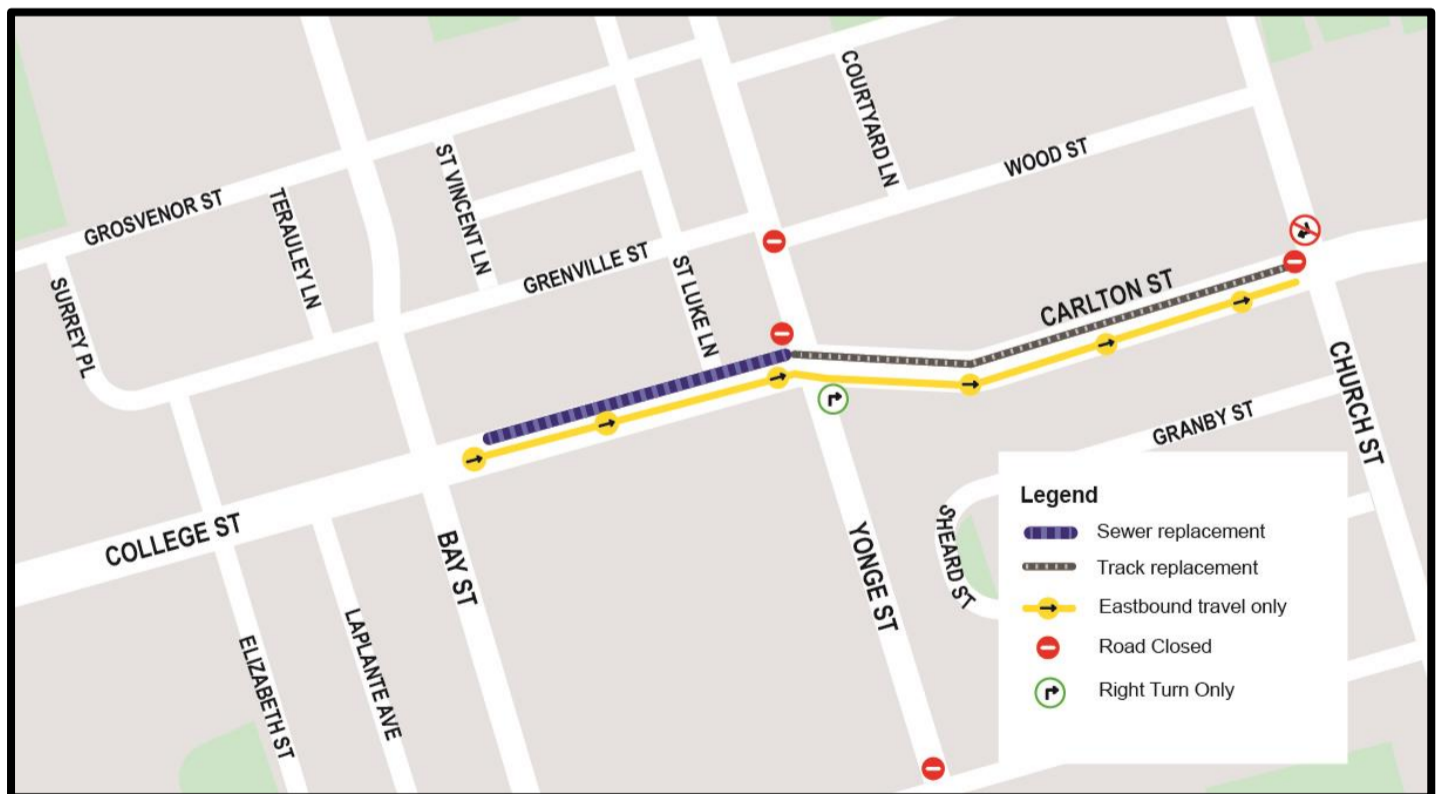
Starting late July, until the end of September, College Street and Carlton Street will be fully closed to westbound travel from Bay Street to Church Street. One eastbound travel lane will be maintained.

From late July until mid-August, the intersection of Yonge Street and College Street will be closed to north-south travel. Northbound right turns and eastbound travel will be maintained.

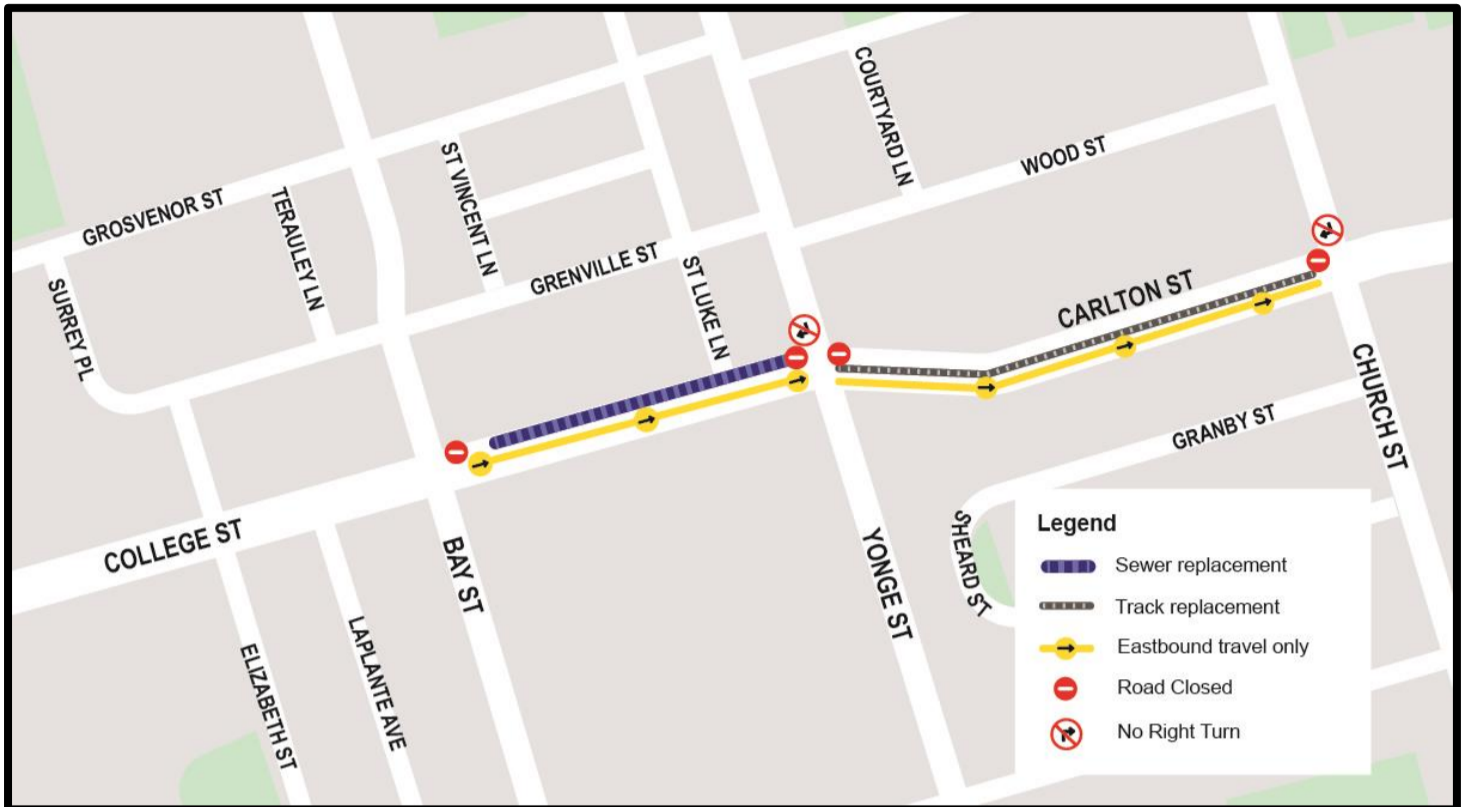
This work is required to replace the sewer that delivers wastewater to treatment plants efficiently and to bring the streetcar track infrastructure to a state of good repair. This project is part of the Council-approved 2026 Capital Works Program.

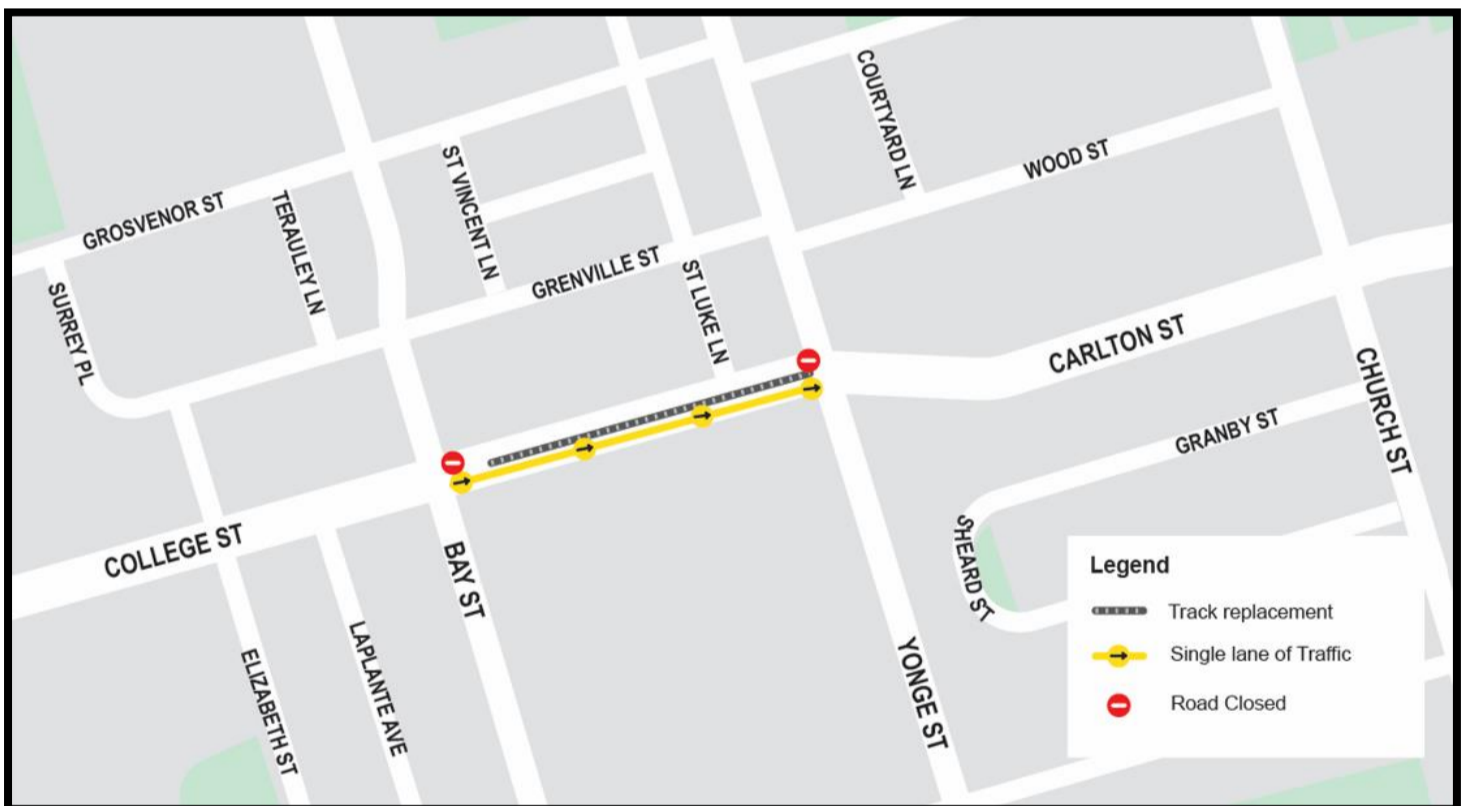
MAP OF PHASE 2A WORK AREA

| <p>Phase 2A – Late July to mid August TTC track replacement at Yonge Street and College Street intersection Track removal from Yonge Street to Church Street</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Partial closure of the Yonge Street and College Street intersection. Northbound right turns and eastbound through traffic only. No north-south travel through the intersection. • One travel lane will be maintained for eastbound travel from Bay Street to Church Street. • No westbound travel. No left turns permitted. • Temporary closures of sidewalks may be required. Pedestrian detours and signage will be in place. |

| <p>Phase 2B - Mid August to end of September Sewer replacement on College Street from Yonge Street to Bay Street and TTC track renewal on Carlton Street from Church Street to Yonge Street</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One travel lane will be maintained for eastbound travel from Bay Street to Church Street on College Street and Carlton Street. • Temporary closures of sidewalks may be required. Pedestrian detours and signage will be in place. • Access to businesses and properties will be maintained. |
| <p>Phase 3 – End of September to December 2026 TTC track replacement on College Street from Yonge Street to Bay Street</p> <p>Overhead work by TTC crews may occur in areas where sewer and track work is not taking place.</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One travel lane will be maintained for eastbound travel from Bay Street to Yonge Street. • One lane in each direction will be maintained at a minimum from Yonge Street to Church Street. • Temporary closures of sidewalks may be required. Pedestrian detours and signage will be in place. • Access to businesses and properties will be maintained. |

Once construction Phase 3 is complete, TTC crews will test the newly constructed tracks.

|  | <p>Work Hours: Work on this project will take place 24 hours, 7 days a week. Excavation activities and heavy breaking will be carried out at various times throughout the day. All concrete breaking activities will occur between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. Concrete breaking work is the most disruptive and will typically last the first 1-2 days for each phase of the construction. Around-the-clock work during rail installation by TTC is required to preserve the integrity and quality of new rail and concrete. Overnight rail work by TTC may consist of moving new rail into position, rail installation and rail welding / grinding.</p> |
|  | <p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with businesses or property owners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p> |
|  | <p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p> |
|  | <p>Traffic Management: Motorists are reminded to abide by traffic/construction signs posted in local areas to ensure the safe travel of all local road users, pedestrians and cyclists. Efforts will be made to manage traffic and closures in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets during this work.</p> |
|  | <p>During Phase 2, 506/306 Carlton streetcars will divert both ways via Bay Street, Dundas Street and Parliament Street to regular routing.</p> |

| | <p>A 506B/306B Carlton replacement bus service will also operate between Spadina Station and Gerrard Street East and Broadview Avenue via Spadina Avenue, College Street, Carlton Street, Parliament Street, and Gerrard Street East.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Eastbound 506B/306B Carlton replacement buses will <u>travel through</u> the construction area on College Street and Carlton Street. • Westbound 506B/306B Carlton replacement buses will <u>divert</u> around the construction via Jarvis Street, Wellesley Street East, and Bay Street. <p>Wheel Trans services will remain accessible in all areas where local traffic is permitted.</p> <p>Please note: Service and routing may be adjusted as construction progresses.</p> <p>For the latest information, visit ttc.ca/CollegeStreet.</p> |
|  | <p>Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.</p> |
|  | <p>Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. <p>If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.</p> <p>Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).</p> |
|  | <p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the City of Toronto contact listed below.</p> |
|  | <p>Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</p> |
