Deadline to Withdraw or Change Office

The deadline for candidates in the 2026 municipal election to withdraw their nomination (or change office) is Friday, August 21 at 2 p.m. Candidate nomination withdrawals or changes must be filed in person. The Toronto Elections office at City Hall will be open on August 21 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Candidate Information Session

A second candidate information session on “Managing your Campaign” will be held on Monday, August 24 from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Similar to the information session held on July 14, it will cover the following topics: campaign finances, the contribution rebate program, the voters' list, election signs and more. You can attend this hybrid session in-person (at Toronto City Hall, Council Chamber) or virtually via WebEx. No registration is required.

Accessing the Voters' List – Important Information

The voters' list will be available to candidates beginning September 1 through the Candidate Access portal.

You will receive an email with your user ID and temporary password for CandidateAccess. Because CandidateAccess is a separate portal from MyCampaign, your user ID and password for these two portals will be different. If you have not already submitted a Voters' List Request form, please contact our office.

Per the [Municipal Elections Act, 1996](#), the voters' list can only be used for election purposes relating to this election. It cannot be used for commercial purposes, copied or distributed for any other purpose, including through the use of artificial intelligence tools. It is the responsibility of the candidate to take precautions to protect the confidentiality of the personal information contained in the voters' list.

If you have not already done so, you can submit contact information in MyCampaign that will be displayed on the [List of Candidates](#) webpage. This is a great way to make your information available to the public, media and community groups should they wish to contact you about your campaign.
