Installation of street direction change on Ferrand Drive north of Windom Road

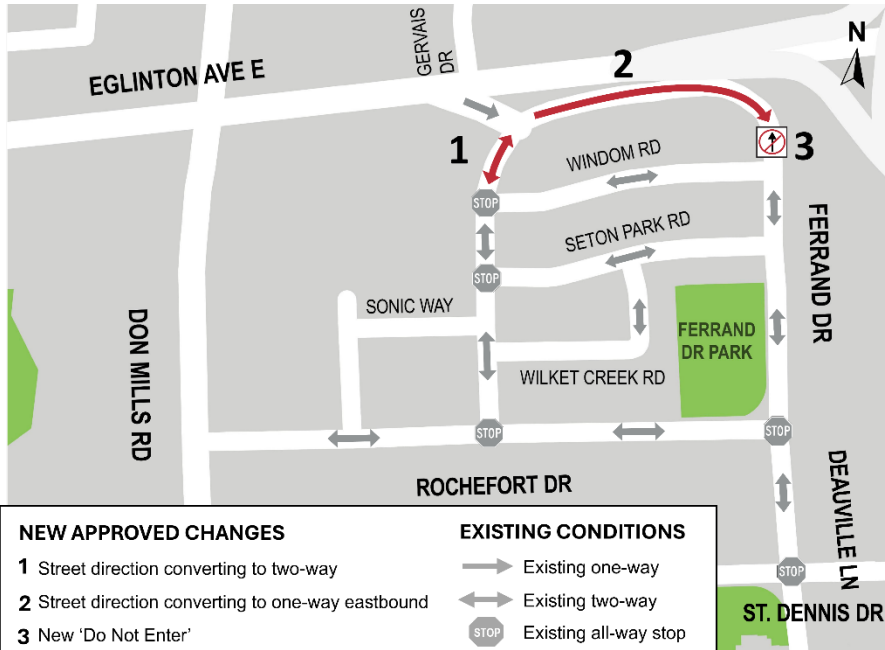
Anticipated Start Date: July 16, 2026
Anticipated End Date: July 24, 2026

The City of Toronto is preparing to change the direction of motor vehicle traffic on Ferrand Drive. Traffic direction will be switched from one-way westbound to one-way eastbound on Ferrand Drive from Windom Road (east) to the on-ramp from Eglinton Avenue East to Ferrand Drive, and to two-way from the on-ramp to Windom Road (west). There are no changes proposed to the number of motor vehicle lanes, to the existing bikeways on Ferrand Drive, or to traffic directions south of Windom Road.

These changes were approved by City Council in June 2026 and are being implemented to improve the efficiency of waste collection operations in the area, and in response to post-installation monitoring of the Ferrand Drive Area Road Safety Improvements.

Key Changes on Ferrand Drive

- 1. Existing one-way motor vehicle traffic converted to two-way traffic on Ferrand Drive, from Eglinton Avenue East on-ramp to Windom Road (west intersection)
- 2. One-way motor vehicle traffic converted from westbound to eastbound direction on Ferrand Drive, from Eglinton Avenue East on-ramp to Windom Road (east intersection)
- 3. No motor vehicle access northbound, north of Windom Road at the east intersection of Ferrand Drive and Windom Road



What to Expect During Installation

City services such as Fire, Paramedics and waste collection will continue during implementation. The adjustment will be implemented using pavement markings, signage and 'quick-build' materials, which involve short installation times and minimal disruption to traffic.

The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts of noise and other inconveniences. We appreciate your patience.

During installation, the City's contractors will complete the following work:

- Remove existing pavement markings and install new markings
- Remove and/or modify existing 'quick build' materials such as bollards and curbs
- Adjust existing signage and install new signage, as required

	Work Hours: Pavement marking changes will take place overnight from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. Daytime work will take place mostly in the off-peak hours/evenings to limit traffic disruptions.
	People Cycling: If travelling on Ferrand Drive, please share the traffic lane in the active work zones.

	Parking and Loading: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects installation, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222. Changes to the parking by-laws will be signed.
	Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers will issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment: a) Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the yellow parking violation notice) or b) File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the yellow parking violation notice). As part of the dispute process, you may submit a copy of this notice. Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones). To reduce ticketing due to installation, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing installation impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
	Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during installation. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, please inform the contact listed below.
