Road Paving and Road Closure – Westview Boulevard and Amsterdam Avenue

Contract: 23ECS-LU-03FP

Start Date: July 6, 2026

Extended July 13, 2026

Schedule is subject to change

The City of Toronto construction contract 23ECS-LU-03FP (Phase 2) has completed the upgrade of the area's storm and sanitary sewer system to reduce surface and basement flooding. The next stage of construction involves roadway paving. This planned work will require a full road closure during weekday work hours.

The roadway restoration work is scheduled for the week of July 6, 2026, through July 13, 2026, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

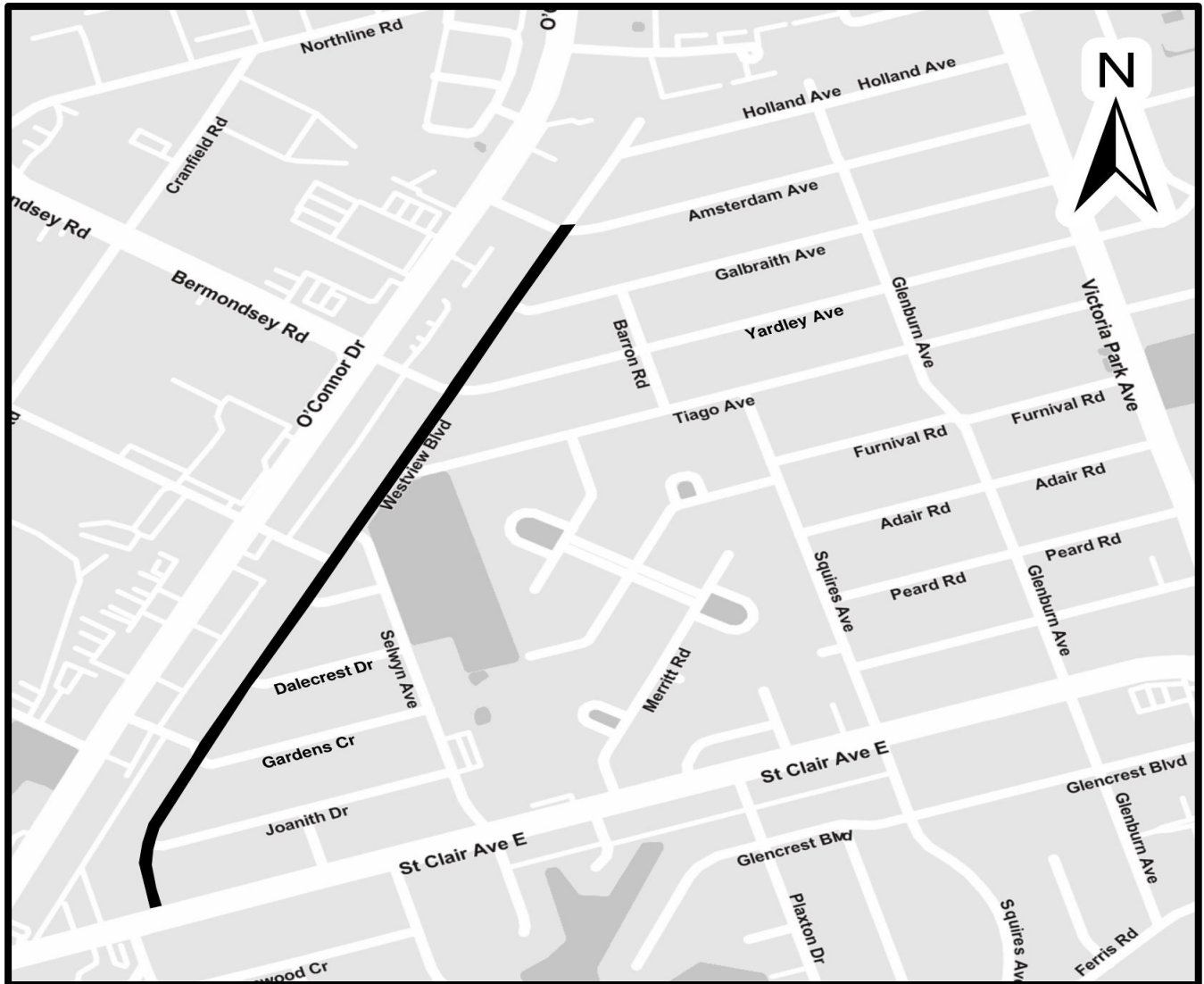
- **Monday, July 6, 2026** – Base asphalt along Westview Boulevard from 158 Westview Boulevard to Amsterdam Avenue
- **Tuesday, July 7, 2026** – Surface asphalt along Westview Boulevard from St Clair Avenue East to Galbraith Avenue
- **Wednesday, July 8, 2026** – Base asphalt along Westview Boulevard from Galbraith Avenue to Amsterdam Avenue
- **Thursday, July 9, 2026** – Surface asphalt milling along Amsterdam Avenue from Westview Boulevard to Victoria Park Avenue
- **Friday, July 10, 2026** – Base asphalt along Westview Boulevard from Galbraith Avenue to Amsterdam Avenue
- **Monday, July 13, 2026** – Surface asphalt along Westview Boulevard from Galbraith to Amsterdam Avenue, and along Amsterdam Avenue from Westview Boulevard to Victoria Park Avenue

This paving work will result in temporary impediments to driveway access for residents. **The contractor will provide advance notice of any temporary driveway access restrictions.**

Please note the scheduling of pavement work is weather dependant and may be adjusted accordingly.

WORK DETAILS

The City’s contractor will:

- Pave along Westview Boulevard
- Mill and pave Amsterdam Avenue from Westview Boulevard to Victoria Park Avenue

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise, and traffic delays.
- Large, heavy construction vehicles in the area. Please exercise caution when driving.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. A separate driveway impact notice will be distributed to residents.
	On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff about the construction site, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below, or ask for the Site Inspector.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. When driving, please be mindful of pedestrians and other road drivers.
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you always park in a legal parking spot.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment: 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy. Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones). To reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
