## Watermain Replacement and Road Resurfacing on Grosvenor Street from Queen’s Park Crescent East to Yonge Street; and Queen’s Park Crescent East from College Street to Queen’s Park

**Contract: 24ECS-LU-10SU**  
**Start Date: September 22, 2025**  
**End Date: Fall 2026**

The City of Toronto’s work on Grosvenor Street is progressing well. This notice is to provide an update on upcoming overnight watermain branch and service connection work on Grosvenor Street from Queen’s Park Crescent East to Yonge Street.

Watermain connection work is being conducted at night to minimize daytime water service disruptions.



The contractor will conduct overnight watermain work overnight from **7:00 PM on Monday, July 13 to 7:00 AM on Saturday, July 18, 2026.**



There will be water disruptions associated with this work, and if your property is expected to be impacted you will receive a separate notice confirming this.

When this overnight work is complete, regular work hours will resume, however more overnight work is anticipated in the near future for which a separate notice will be issued.

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p>

	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Water Flushing:</b> You will see water flushing or running in several areas along this project due to cleaning the new watermain. Before substandard water services are replaced and the new watermain is put into service, the new pipe must meet Toronto Water's servicing and quality standards. <b>Please DO NOT DRINK OR USE THE FLUSHING WATER, it is not potable.</b></p>
