Birchmount Road Culvert Rehabilitation over West Highland Creek

Contract: 26ECS-BE-07PM
 Start Date: August 2026 End Date: December 2026

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Birchmount Road Culvert over West Highland Creek. This work will ensure that the culvert meets today’s standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2026 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS

- The City’s contractor will complete:
- Partial depth concrete removal for spall and delamination areas
 - Concrete patch repairs and crack injection of the existing culvert
 - Removal of debris and repair the bottom slabs on all barrels by concrete overlay
 - Removal and replacement of the existing chain link fence
 - Extension of the northwest wingwall and west headwall, and elimination of the gabion wall
 - Installation of a scour pool and channel restoration

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
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	Pre-Construction Inspection: The Contractor, under contract to the City of Toronto, is conducting inspections of properties in the vicinity of the construction area before construction starts. Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment for the inspection. The inspection will look at the exterior and interior of properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all property owners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. • Traffic on Birchmount Road will be reduced to one lane of traffic in the southbound direction for the duration of construction.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
