

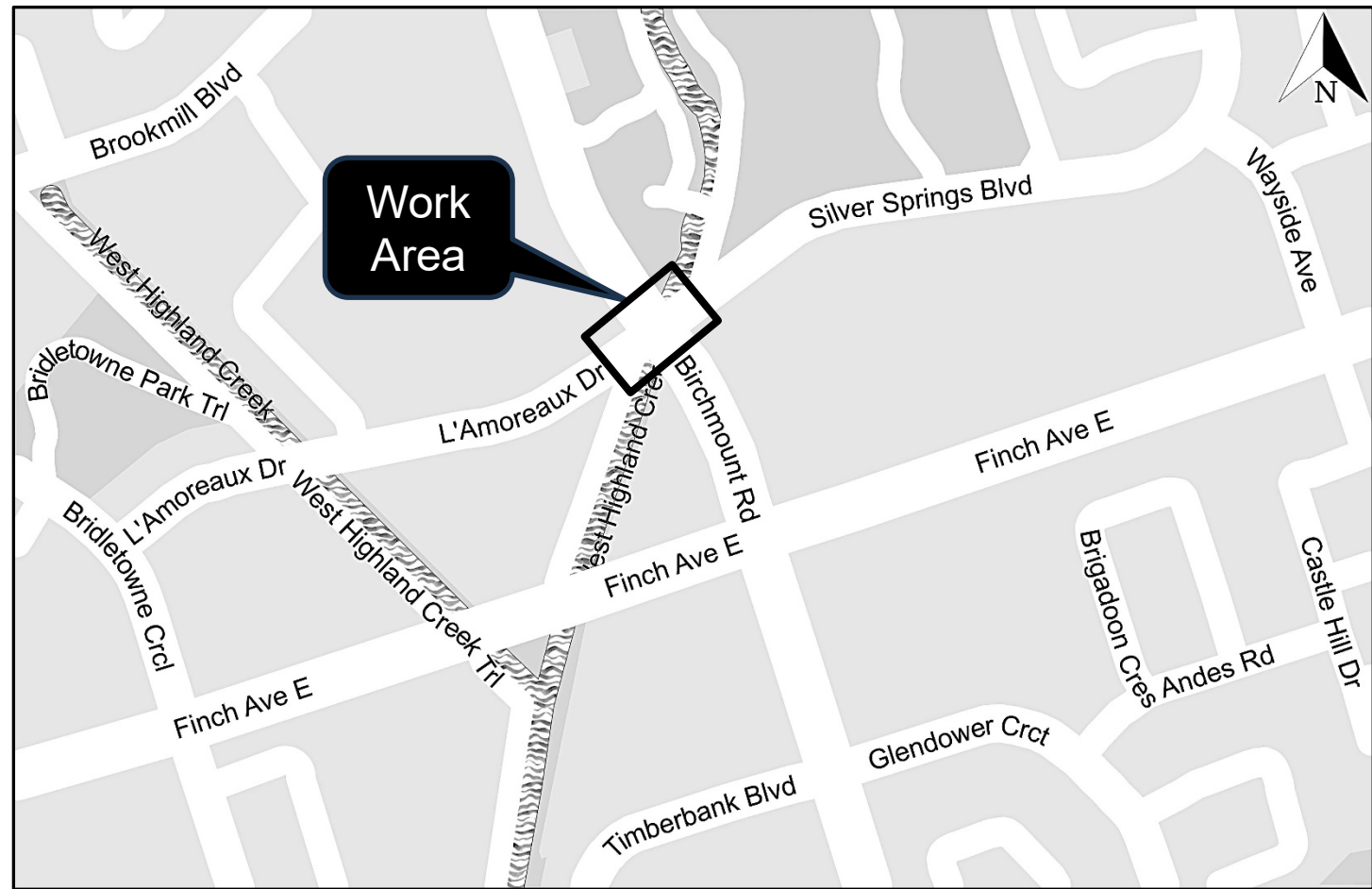

Birchmount Road Culvert Rehabilitation over West Highland Creek

Contract: 26ECS-BE-07PM
Start Date: August 2026 End Date: December 2026

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Birchmount Road Culvert over West Highland Creek. This work will ensure that the culvert meets today’s standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2026 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS

- The City’s contractor will:
- Rehabilitate the existing culvert with a spray in place pipe structural liner
 - Complete patch repair and crack injection on the existing concrete retaining walls
 - Clean and prepare the existing culvert by air blasting and grout injection prior to structural liner installation
 - Install chain-link fence

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
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	Pre-Construction Inspection: The Contractor, under contract to the City of Toronto, is conducting inspections of properties in the vicinity of the construction area before construction starts. Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment for the inspection. The inspection will look at the exterior and interior of properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all property owners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: There will be no restrictions on road and sidewalk access within the work zone. Birchmount Road, Silver Springs Boulevard, and L'Amoreaux Drive will be open to traffic for the duration of construction. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout construction with no sidewalk restrictions. Temporary flagging of pedestrian and vehicular traffic may be utilized for equipment and material deliveries.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
