

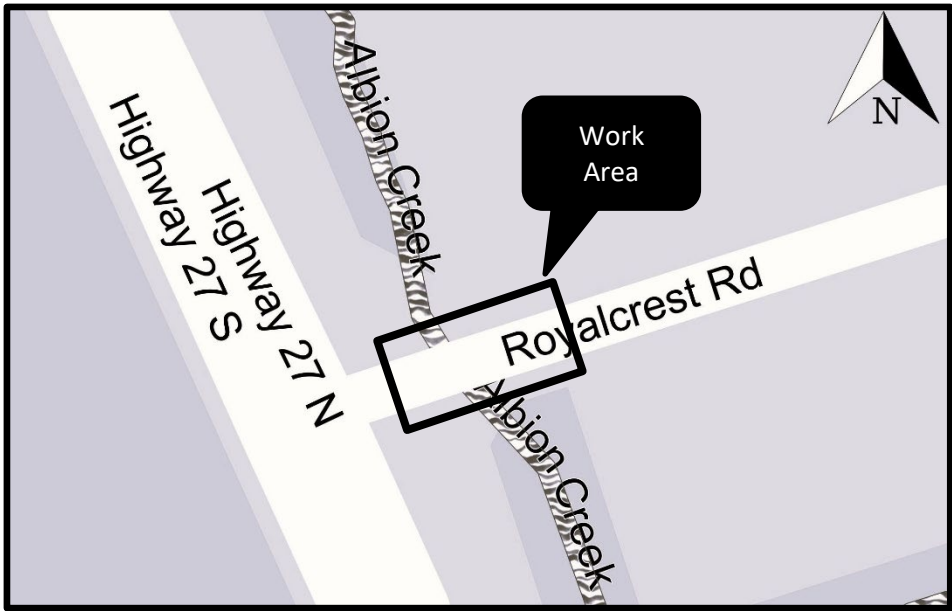

Royalcrest Road Culvert Replacement
over Albion Creek

Contract: 26ECS-BE-06PM
Start Date: August 2026 End Date: April 2027

The City of Toronto is planning to replace the Royalcrest Road Culvert over Albion Creek. This work will ensure that the culvert meets today’s standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2026 Capital Works Program.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Pedestrian and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout construction with one sidewalk opened at all times. Pedestrians will be required to cross the road at the nearest crosswalk to access the open sidewalk during construction.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. To complete this work safely and efficiently, there will be a road closure at the Highway 27 and Royalcrest Road intersection for the duration of the construction. Entrances for businesses on Royalcrest Road will continue to be maintained. Temporary traffic signals will be deployed at the intersection of Highway 27 and Mars Road during staging work.

	Transit: Royalcrest Road will be closed to traffic for the duration of construction. A detour will be in place to divert the TTC bus service. Refer to TTC.ca for TTC Routes & Schedules.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone and detour is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
