Closed Meeting Requirements: As per The City of Toronto Act, 2006, Section 190, should the Administrative Penalty Tribunal want to meet in closed meeting (privately), a member of the panel must make a motion to do so and state the reason the Administrative Penalty Tribunal will meet in closed session.

Public Deputations by Oral Presentation: A notice of intention to make a public deputation by oral presentation on a Business Meeting agenda item must be registered with the Secretary at least two (2) business days prior to the meeting by 12 p.m. (noon).
