Oakwood Village Road Safety Improvements

Start Date: Week of July 27th 2026*

** Start date is dependent on weather conditions, and subject to change. Work will take approximately two weeks.*

The City of Toronto is preparing to install road safety improvements in Oakwood Village including two new traffic signals and shared and contraflow bikeways to support road safety in the neighbourhood.

The project was approved by City Council in June 2026 following consultation through the Oakwood Village Streets Plan and the Vaughan Road and Wychwood Avenue Safety Improvements project. Changes east of Oakwood Avenue are planned for installation in July, and changes on, and west of Oakwood Avenue will be installed once the new traffic signal at Oakwood Avenue and Holland Park Avenue is installed in late 2026 or early 2027.

Installation Map:



Planned Installation: July 2026

Robina Avenue and sections of Holland Park Avenue, Hursting Avenue, and Maplewood Avenue:

- Painted sharrows showing a shared roadway for people driving and cycling.

Earlsdale Avenue (between Oakwood Avenue and Winona Drive):

- New contraflow bikeway to allow eastbound cycling.
- Parking will be fixed (permanent) on the south side.

Arlington Avenue (between Hursting Avenue and Maplewood Avenue):

- Fixing parking on the east side and adding a contraflow bikeway for northbound cycling.

Future Installation: Late 2026 / Early 2027

New Traffic Controls:

- Two new traffic signals will be installed to support safer crossings at Oakwood Avenue and Holland Park Avenue, and at Vaughan Road and Wychwood Avenue.

The following will be installed after the Oakwood Avenue and Holland Park traffic signal is installed:

- Contraflow bikeway on Holland Park Avenue between Robina Avenue and Oakwood Avenue, extending the current westbound one-way street between Robina Avenue and the Green P parking lot to Oakwood Avenue to allow westbound cycling.
- Contraflow bikeway on Holland Park Avenue between Oakwood Avenue and Glenholme Avenue to allow eastbound cycling. Parking will be fixed on the south side.
- Northbound parking-protected bikeway on the east side of Oakwood Avenue, between Earlsdale Avenue and Holland Park Avenue.

What to Expect During Installation

Installation will happen overnight on weekdays starting after approximately 9 p.m. over two weeks. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts of noise and other inconveniences. Traffic signal installation will be during the day. During installation, the City’s contractors will complete the following work:

- Removal of existing road line markings where adjustments are required
- Painting of new line markings and road symbols

City services such as Fire, Paramedics and garbage pick-up will continue as usual.

	Work Hours: Overnight from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday to Thursday to minimize disruption to daytime travel and business operations.
	• Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. • Side Street Access: Turns through the work zone will be restricted and signed.
	Parking and Loading: On-street parking may be temporarily impacted during installation. Road signs and flyers will provide details closer to the start of work. If your parked vehicle affects installation, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .
	Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers will issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment: 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the yellow parking violation notice) or 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the yellow parking violation notice). As part of the dispute process, you may submit a copy of this notice. Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones). In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during installation. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, please inform the contact listed below.
