Local Road Rehabilitation on Erskine Avenue and Redpath Avenue

INTERSECTION CLOSURES

Start Date: August 4, 2026 | End Date: August 28, 2026

In July 2026, the City of Toronto distributed a Construction Update notifying residents of the planned closure of the intersection at Erskine Avenue and Redpath Avenue to pedestrian and vehicular traffic through early August as part of the Local Road Rehabilitation project. This update outlines project progress, revised construction schedules, and anticipated completion dates.

Erskine Avenue and Yonge Street Partial Intersection Closure (August 4 - 7)

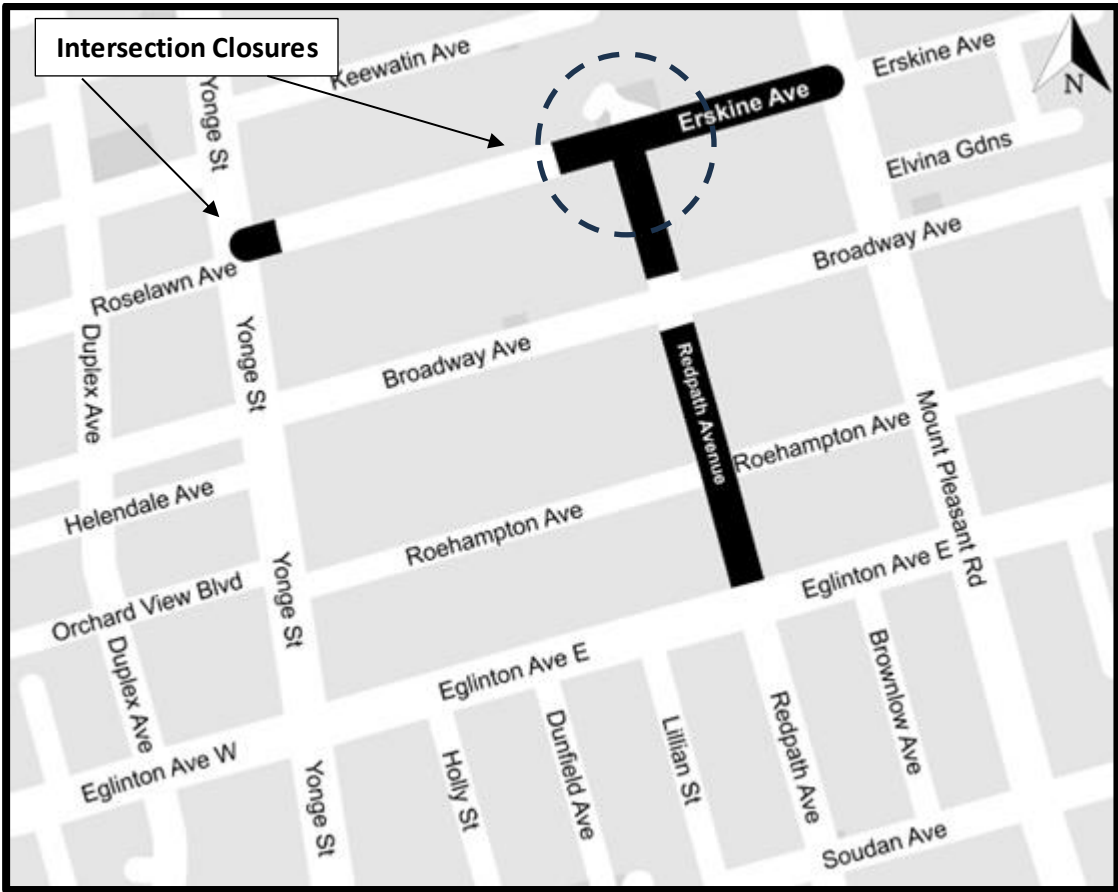
To expedite completion of this project and minimize future disruptions, construction activities at the intersection started on **Tuesday August 4, 2026 and are expected to be completed by Friday August 7, 2026**. During this period, the corners of Erskine Avenue and Yonge Street will be closed for sidewalk and curb restoration work at Yonge Street and Erskine Avenue. The southbound curb lane on Yonge Street approaching Erskine Avenue will be temporarily closed during road work, until August 7. This section of the road will be closed overnight as well for pedestrian safety.

Revised Erskine Avenue and Redpath Avenue Intersection Closure Dates (August 14- 28)

Due to unforeseen emergency repairs completed by Toronto Water, the schedule for the intersection closure has been revised. The intersection at Erskine Avenue and Redpath Avenue is now scheduled to be fully closed from **Friday August 14, 2026, to approximately Friday, August 28, 2026**. The closure is required to facilitate road milling, reconstruction, and paving operations in advance of the installation of pedestrian safety improvements at the intersection

Residents are encouraged to use adjacent streets while intersection work is underway. Traffic control personnel and signage will be present on-site to direct motorists, pedestrians, and cyclists safely through the area and along designated detour routes.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Telephone and Internet Services: This work may affect phone and internet cables for individual properties that aren't buried deep below the sidewalk. The contractor will coordinate with utility companies to minimize disruption. Residents who find their service has been disrupted should contact the Field Ambassador <u>and</u> notify their phone or internet service provider.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. • Pedestrians will be directed to the other side of the street during sidewalk construction. Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. • During the intersection closures there will be a paid duty officer to manage traffic control. • There will be lane reductions on sections of the street while active underground and above ground road construction is taking place.
	On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment: 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) <u>or</u> 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.

	Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones). In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
