Governor’s Road Bridge Rehabilitation over Moore Park Ravine Bridge Closure Update

The City of Toronto is rehabilitating the Governor’s Road Bridge over Moore Park Ravine. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today’s standards and remains safe into the future.

BRIDGE CLOSURE UPDATE

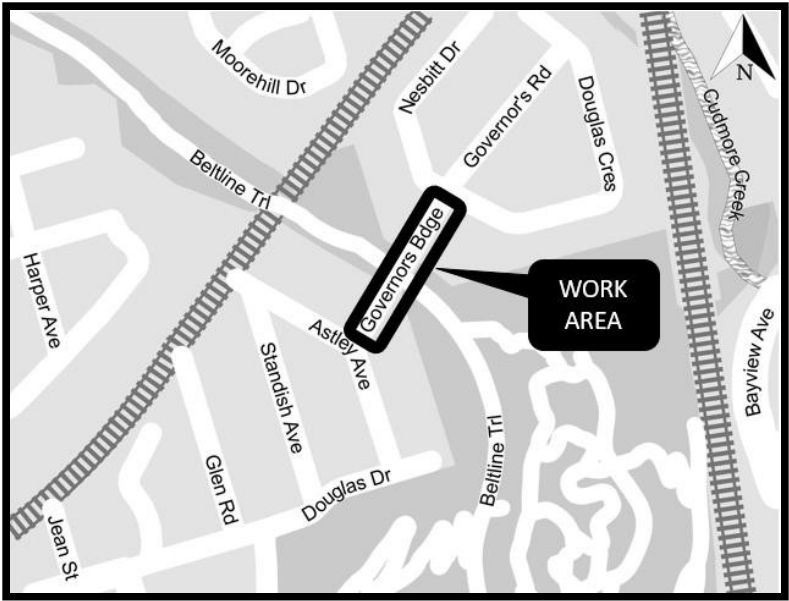
Since the full bridge closure began on July 6, significant progress has been made including substructure concrete rehabilitation work, soffit refacing and the application of a concrete sealer to most areas.

On the deck, the Contractor has completed approximately half of the parapet wall refacing and deck patching repairs, and is currently progressing with the waterproofing, asphalt paving, and railing connection repairs.

As work has progressed, additional repairs and weather-related impacts have affected the construction schedule. As a result, additional time is required to safely complete the remaining work and the full bridge closure has been extended until **late August 2026**.

We know this project has an impact on the community. We appreciate your patience as we work to complete this City infrastructure project.

WORK STATUS TO DATE

To date, the City’s contractor has completed:

- Repairs and/ or refacing the bridge piers, abutments, soffit, wing walls, parapet wall, and deck.

REMAINING WORK

- Continue with parapet wall refacing and railing connection repairs.
- Replace the asphalt surface, waterproofing, and lighting fixtures.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Friday, and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturdays. No work will occur on Sundays and Statutory holidays.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. At least one sidewalk will always remain open at all times. Temporary signage will direct pedestrians to cross the bridge safely.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. The bridge is closed to public traffic until late August 2026. One sidewalk will be closed for material storage and repair activities during this project. Turn Restrictions and Nesbitt Drive/Bayview Avenue The current turn restrictions at Nesbitt and Bayview will be temporarily lifted during the full bridge closure. They will be reinstated once the bridge is reopened during construction and will remain in place after construction is complete.
	On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
