Road Rehabilitation and Bike Lane Updates on Huntingwood Drive from Pharmacy Avenue to Kennedy Road

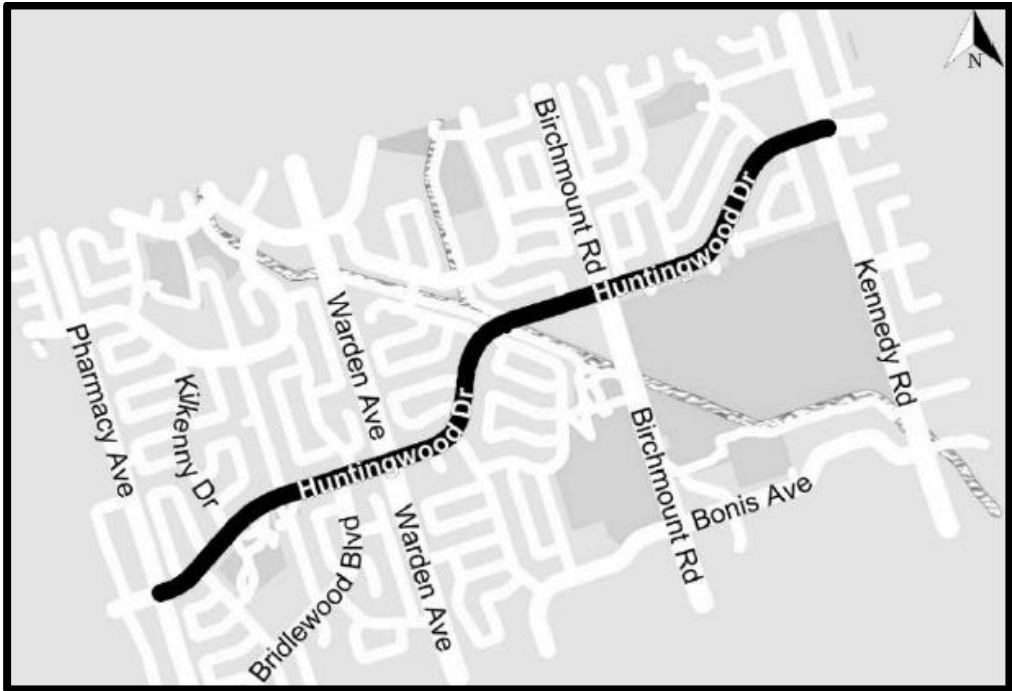
This notice provides an update on the road rehabilitation and bike lane improvements on Huntingwood Drive, from Pharmacy Avenue to Kennedy Road. Due to delays caused by conflicting infrastructure work within the project limits, deficiency repair work has been rescheduled to start later in the summer.

Deficiency Repair Work along Huntingwood Drive

Starting Monday August 24, 2026, construction crews will return to Huntingwood Drive to complete road deficiencies and bikeway median island adjustments. To facilitate the completion of this work, the following road closures will be required on Huntingwood Drive. Access for local traffic will be maintained at all times.

WORK STATUS TO DATE

- The City’s contractor is returning to repair any deficient areas identified in the road and complete final milling and paving on Huntingwood Drive.

REMAINING WORK: DEFICIENCY WORKS

- Road base repairs
- Adjust raised median islands and planters to allow for more on street parking
- Final milling and paving

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.
	TTC Service Impacts: TTC services will experience significant disruptions, which may lead to potential detours. During road work on Huntingwood Drive, TTC service will be diverted. Diversion information will be available at the TTC website.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
	Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions; however any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.
	Cyclists: If travelling on Huntingwood Drive, please share the traffic lane in the active work zones
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Parking Violation Notice: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment: 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy. Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones). In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
