Sanitary forcemain replacement on your street

Contract: 23TW-CTS-17CWD
 Original Start Date: October 2025

In September 2025, the City of Toronto distributed a Construction Notice for a sanitary forcemain replacement (a pressurized sewer pipe that transports wastewater from a lower to higher elevation) in your neighbourhood. Due to schedule updates, the construction timeline has been updated and this work will now end/finish by November 2026.

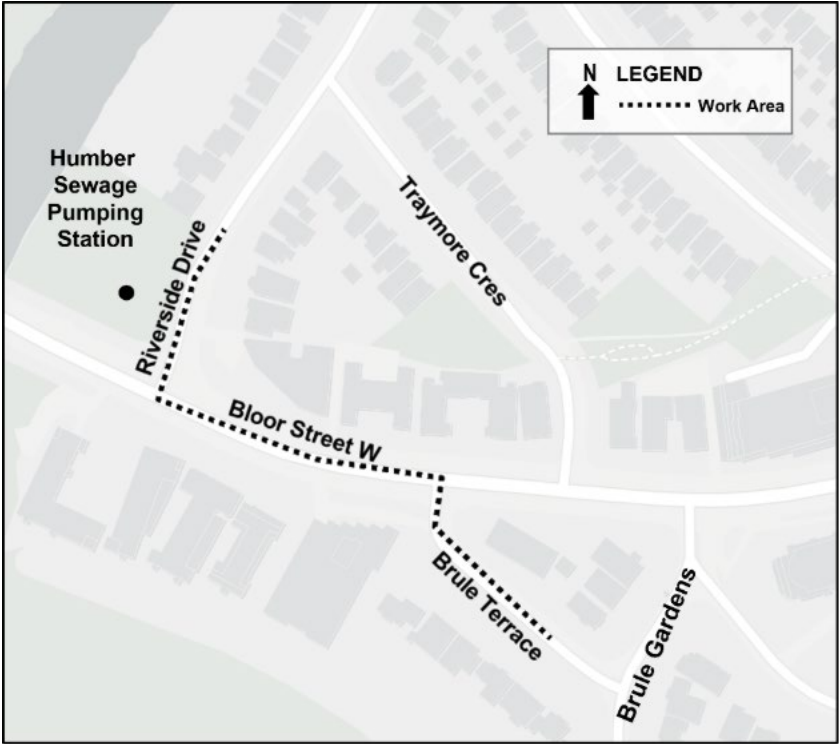
In fall 2025, the project team completed preliminary site investigation work on Brule Terrace, Bloor Street West and Riverside Drive.

The City will be starting active construction on Brule Terrace in August 2026. This is later than the October 2025 start date last reported to you in the previous Construction Notice. This will be followed by active construction on Bloor Street West, then Riverside Drive, ending with work at the Humber Sewage Pumping Station.

Work will take place on **Brule Terrace** from **Bloor Street West** to 20 m west of **Brule Gardens**, **Bloor Street West** from **Riverside Drive** to **Brule Terrace**, **Riverside Drive** from **Bloor Street West** to 100 m north of **Bloor Street West** and at the **Humber Sewage Pumping Station**. Please find a map of the work area below.

This project is part of the Council-approved Capital Works Program to renew aging infrastructure, reducing the risk of forcemain breaks and collapses.

REMAINING WORK TO BE DONE

In the first few weeks, the City’s contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Incrementally excavate the road and dig a trench to install the new sanitary forcemains.
- Install the new forcemains.
- Work inside the pumping station, including checking and replacing equipment.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing a portion of driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required and in accordance with the City of Toronto's Noise Bylaw. You will be notified in advance of any changes to work hours.
	Construction noise: You may experience intermittent noise and vibration during construction (from vacuum trucks, power generators, air compressors, etc.). All work will comply with the City of Toronto's Noise Bylaw.
	Road and sidewalk access: To safely complete the work, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone on Brule Terrace from Bloor Street West to Brule Gardens and Riverside Drive from Bloor Street West. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Driveway access on Brule Terrace, Bloor Street West, and Riverside Drive will be maintained during construction. This is subject to change. The bike lanes on Bloor Street West between Brule Terrace and Riverside Drive will be temporarily closed during construction on Bloor Street West.
	Traffic management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users, and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Permanent restoration of the curb and sidewalk will take place within 18 to 24 months.
	Accessible accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
