What is a Municipal Election?

Toronto's mayor, city councillors and school board trustees make decisions that affect your everyday life, from housing, transit and cycling infrastructure to parks, libraries and community services. Voting in Toronto's municipal election is your chance to shape the future of this city.

Can I Vote?

To vote in Toronto's 2026 municipal election, you must be:

- a Canadian citizen; and
- at least 18 years old; and
- a resident in the city of Toronto; or
- a non-resident of Toronto, but you or your spouse own or rent property in Toronto; and
- not prohibited from voting under any law.

Additional information for students who meet the eligibility requirements:

Student 1: "I'm not from Toronto but live in Toronto while attending school."



- If your permanent home address is outside of Toronto but you live in Toronto to attend school, you can vote in the 2026 municipal election.
- You must vote in the Toronto ward where you live while attending school, and show ID with your name and Toronto address.

Student 2: "I'm from Toronto and attend school in Toronto."



- You must vote in the Toronto ward where your permanent home is located. If you live in a school residence or other temporary residence in Toronto, you will vote in the Toronto ward where your permanent home is located.

Do I need to register to vote?

It's important to ensure you're on the voters' list and that your information is correct. Being on the voters' list before you go to vote will make the voting process faster.

Visit **toronto.ca/Elections** or call **311** to confirm, add or update your voters' list information.

The deadline to make changes to the voters' list online is Sunday, October 11 at 7 p.m.

You can also add your name to the voters' list in person during advance voting or on election day.

What ID do I need to vote?

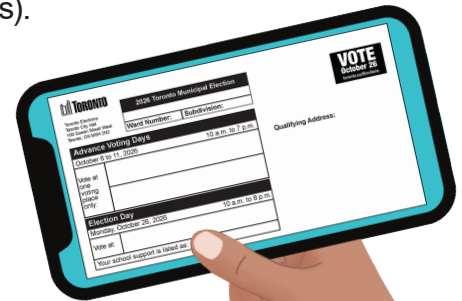
To vote, you **must** show one piece of acceptable identification (ID) with your name and qualifying Toronto address. Photo ID is not required.

Examples of Acceptable ID:

- Ontario-issued photo card or driver's licence (with your Toronto address).
- Rental or lease agreement.
- Phone bill or utility bill (hydro, water, gas or internet)
- School issued document showing campus residence address (if that is your primary Toronto address).
