This year, Nuit Blanche's central hub of activity is located in Downtown Toronto. Visitors will find a high volume of projects and activities in this area.

TTC (Toronto Transit Commission) Instructions

Get to City Hall, Nathan Phillips Square, Church of Holy Trinity and Old City Hall by subway, streetcar or local bus. The closest subway stations are [Osgoode](#) and [Queen](#) on Line 1 Yonge–University.

Osgoode Station's Accessible Entrance: 145 Queen Street West

Queen Station's Accessible Entrance: 2 Queen Street East

Note: The 501 streetcar and 301/301B bus route change is in effect due to construction on Queen Street West. TTC detours south to Adelaide Street West between York Street and Church Street. Queen Street West will be closed for pedestrians between York Street and Bay Street for Nuit Blanche.

Directions from Osgoode Station:

- Find exit to East Side University Avenue
- Turn right
- Turn left
- Take stairs, turn right to exit to street
- OR Turn right, enter elevator to Floor M, Exit to street
- Turn right
- Turn right
- Head east on Queen Street West along the north sidewalk
- Arrive at Nuit Blanche

Directions from Queen Station:

- Find 2 Queen Street East exit
- Take the escalators, Turn left, Turn right to exit to street
- OR Take the elevator to G, Turn right, Turn right to exit to street
- Turn left towards Yonge Street and Queen Street West intersection
- Cross street to south west corner
- Head west on Queen Street West along the south sidewalk
- Arrive at Nuit Blanche

Note: Narrow pathways along Queen Street West due to construction. Two sections allow AODA clearance for mobility devices to turn around.

Drop-off:

There is a passenger drop-off zone at the City Hall North Entrance on Hagerman Street at Elizabeth Street. This area is best for Wheel-Trans or accessible taxis. Wheel-Trans self-booking link [HERE](#).

Washrooms

Nathan Phillips Square: 100 Queen Street West Two accessible, gendered washrooms are inside the Snack & Skate booth west of the TORONTO Sign and pond until 10 PM. There is one accessible stall per washroom.

Event Centre: Bay Street between Queen Street West and Albert Street
Accessible, all-gender portalets.

Event Centre

The Event Centre is the central hub for Nuit Blanche visitors, offering services to help you enjoy your night. The Event Centre includes:

- Food trucks, water refill stations and waste/recycling bins
- Information tent with Nuit Blanche staff and volunteers distributing maps and answering questions
- Navigation Cube with wayfinding and event details visible from all sides
- Gender neutral accessible portalet washrooms

Location: On Bay Street north of Queen Street West intersection

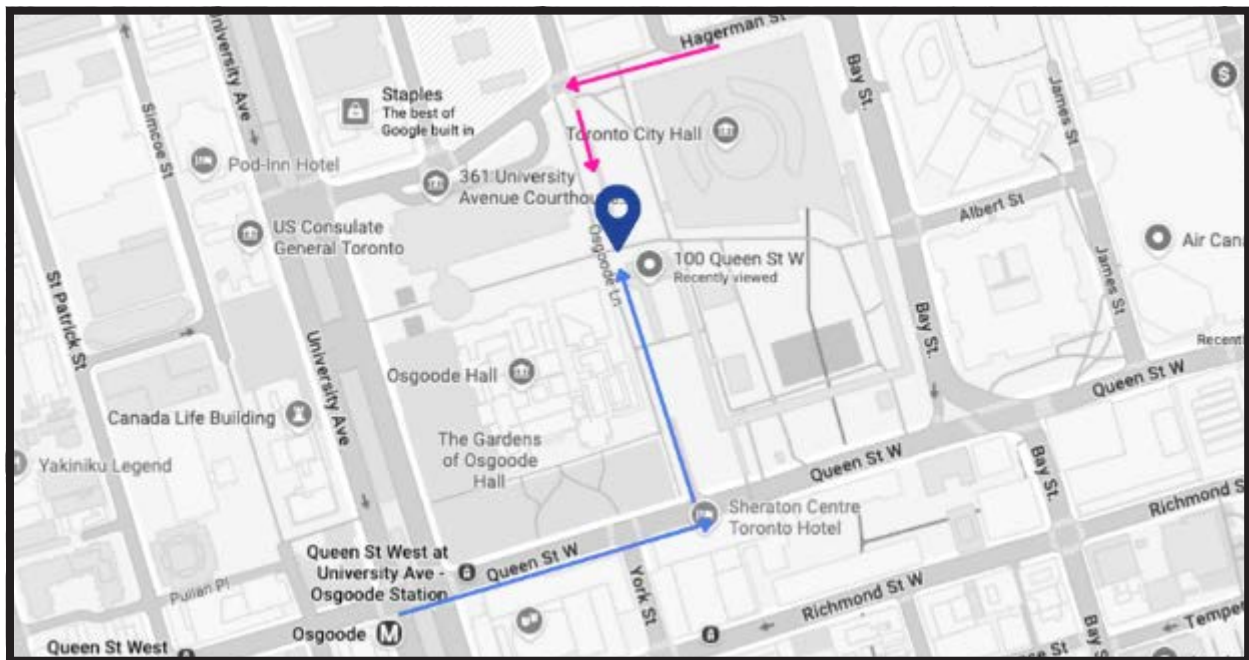
Marco Baldonado - *Rosa's Garden*

An immersive installation inspired by the rituals of a 99-year-old gardener. Audiences will move through clotheslines, harvest baskets, photographs, sound and a video portrait of Rosa, experiencing a surreal sensory journey through aging, nature, willpower and the wisdom passed down through generations.

Brandon Vickerd - *UFO*

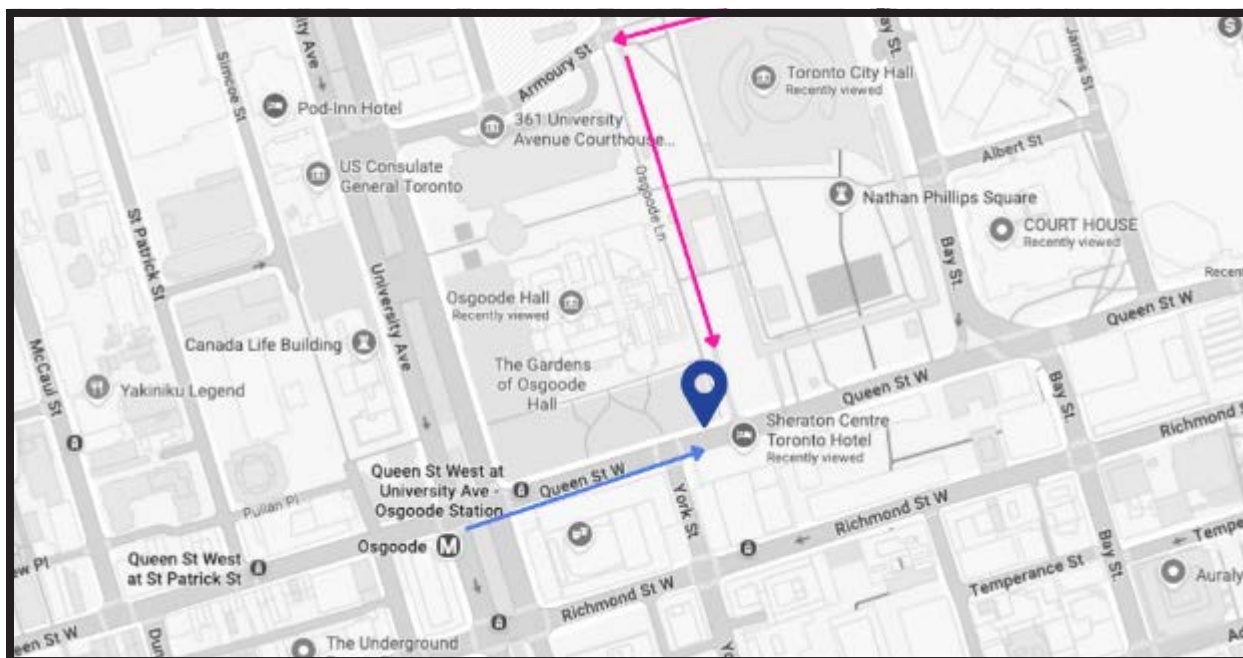

Extended Project: Moves to the northeast corner of Queen St W and Bay Street, in front of Old City Hall; on display until October 10, 2026.

Shelley Niro - *Blankets (Under) Cover, 2022*

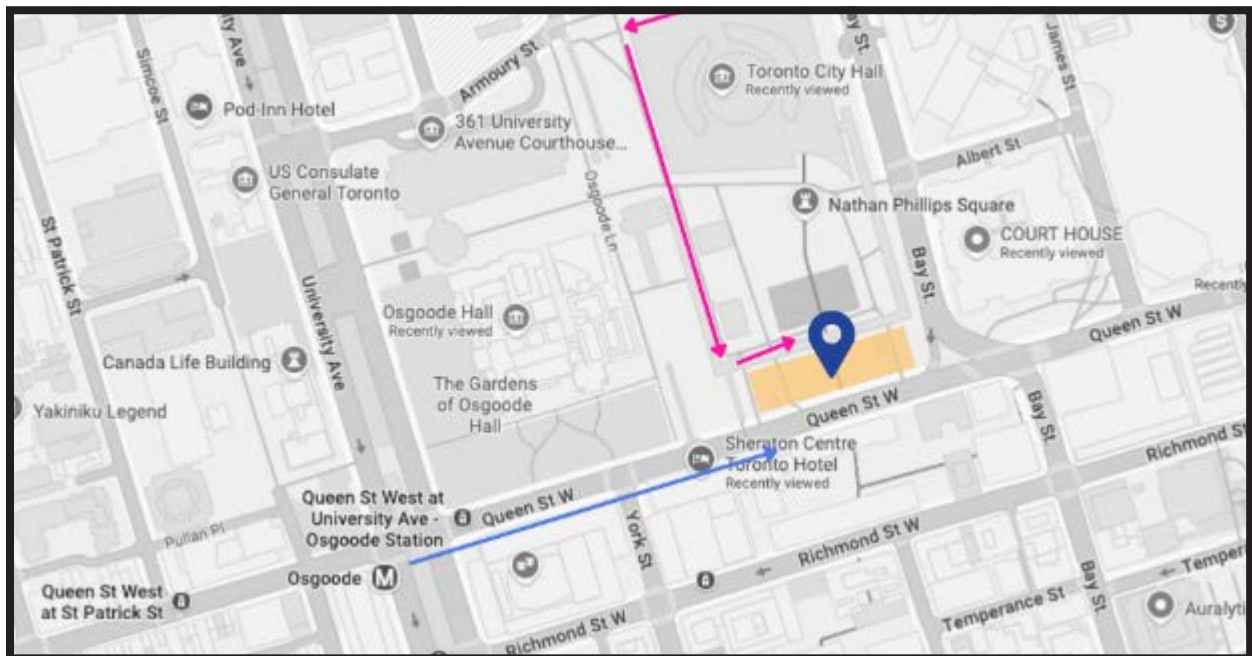
Thirteen point blankets—one per province and territory—are adorned with wildlife once devastated by colonial industry and with images of Indigenous people in daily and communal life. The work critiques the extractive foundations of Canada while celebrating cultural continuity, embodying Niro's blend of sharp political insight and fierce love for her community.

Address: Nathan Phillips Square, 100 Queen Street West, south of the pond and north of Queen Street West

Venue Type: Outdoor

Extended Project: On display until October 10, 2026.

Alexandra Gelis - *in Water, Together*

in Water, Together invites visitors into a glowing architecture of water and light at City Hall. As people move together, they remix hundreds of videos and sounds recorded by the artist around the world, revealing water as a living archive of memory, migration and possible futures.

Couzyn van Heuvelen - *Avataq*

In Inuit hunting, the *avataq*—a float made from a single sealskin—is used with a harpoon to track and tire marine animals. This work draws on the *avataq*'s resemblance to foil balloons, merging their associations to spotlight a site through a celebratory balloon-like form while honouring Inuit culture and tradition.

Lisa Kiss - *band band clock*

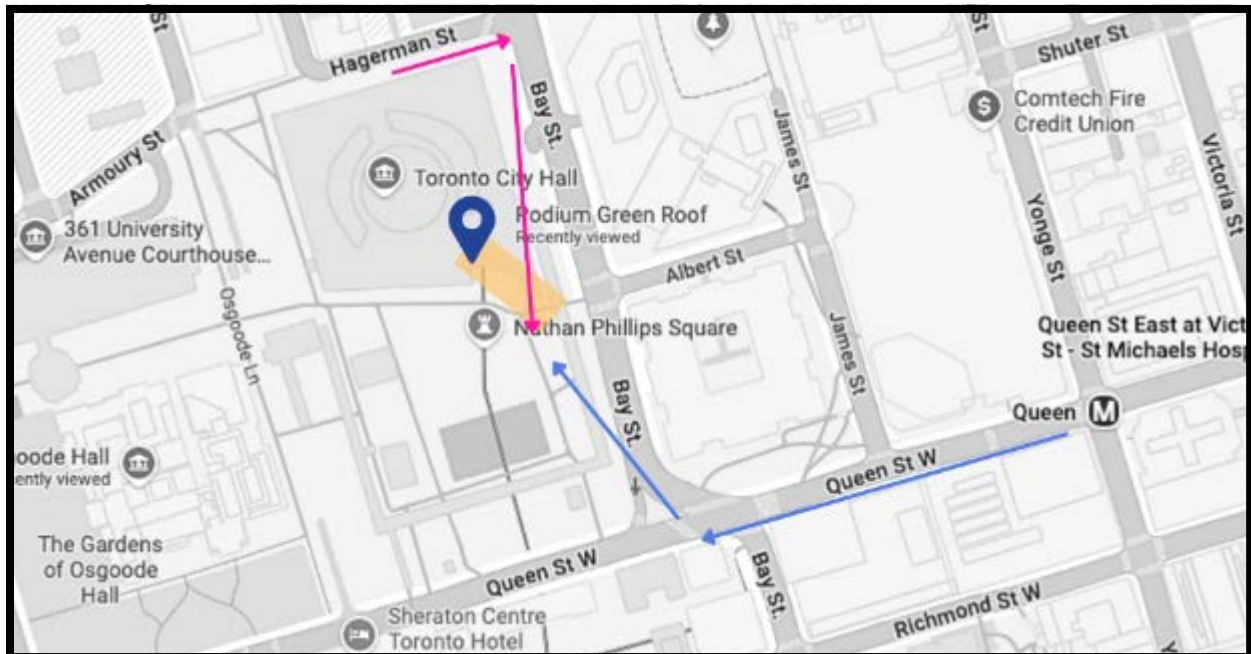
A marching band of marching bands will form for one night only to chime in the thirteen hours of Nuit Blanche 2026. Leaping off the pages and walls of the Nuit Blanche 2026 creative campaign, designed especially for the 20th anniversary by Lisa Kiss, bands will appear on the ramp at City Hall every hour on the hour.

Joseph David Providence Farrugia - *Echoes of the Apiary*

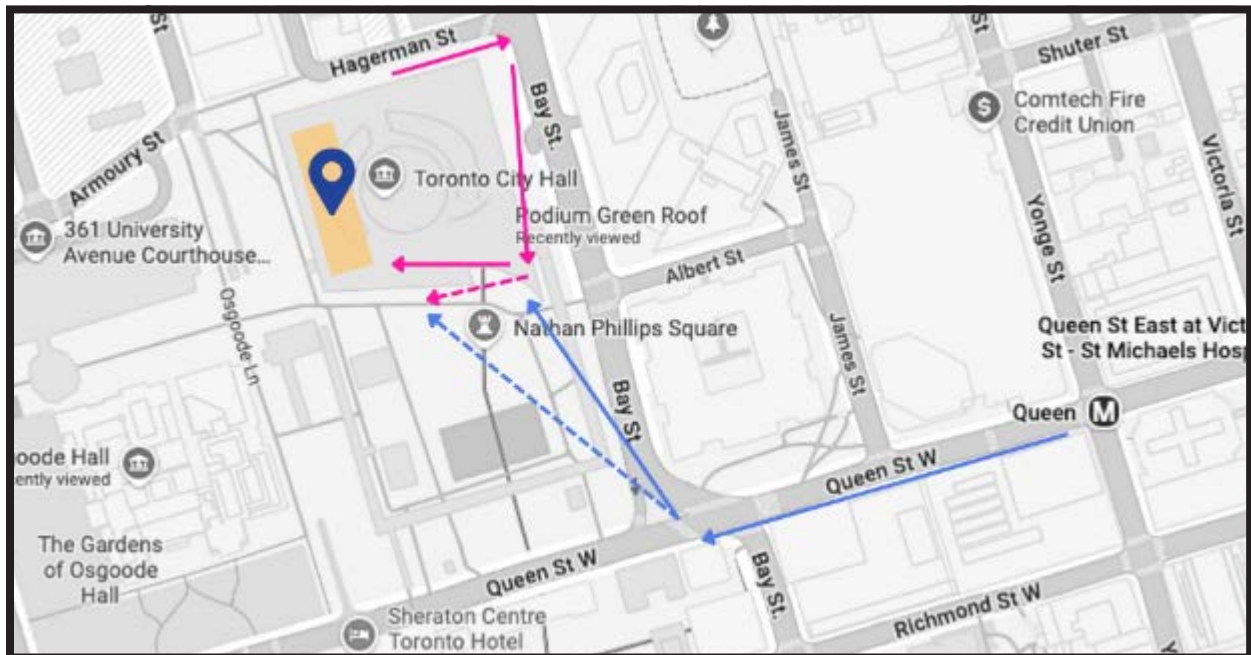
Echoes of the Apiary transforms the podium green roof of Toronto's City Hall into a glowing environment of illuminated beehives, drifting smoke and immersive sound. Blending sculpture, atmosphere and public gathering, the installation invites audiences to reflect on humanity's relationship with bees, memory and the natural world.

Address: City Hall, 100 Queen Street West

Venue Type: Outdoor

Extended Project Note: On display until October 10, 2026

Brendan Fernandes - *On Flashing Lights*

This light and sound installation transforms the underground parking garage at Toronto City Hall into a site of collective gathering, movement and reflection. A formation of police vehicles occupies the space, their flashing lights and visual rhythms becoming the atmospheric backdrop for an evening of dance.

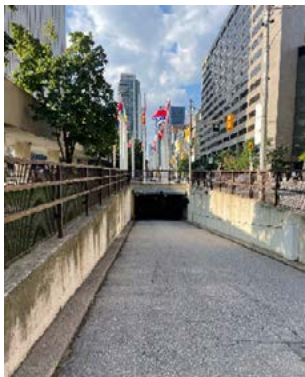

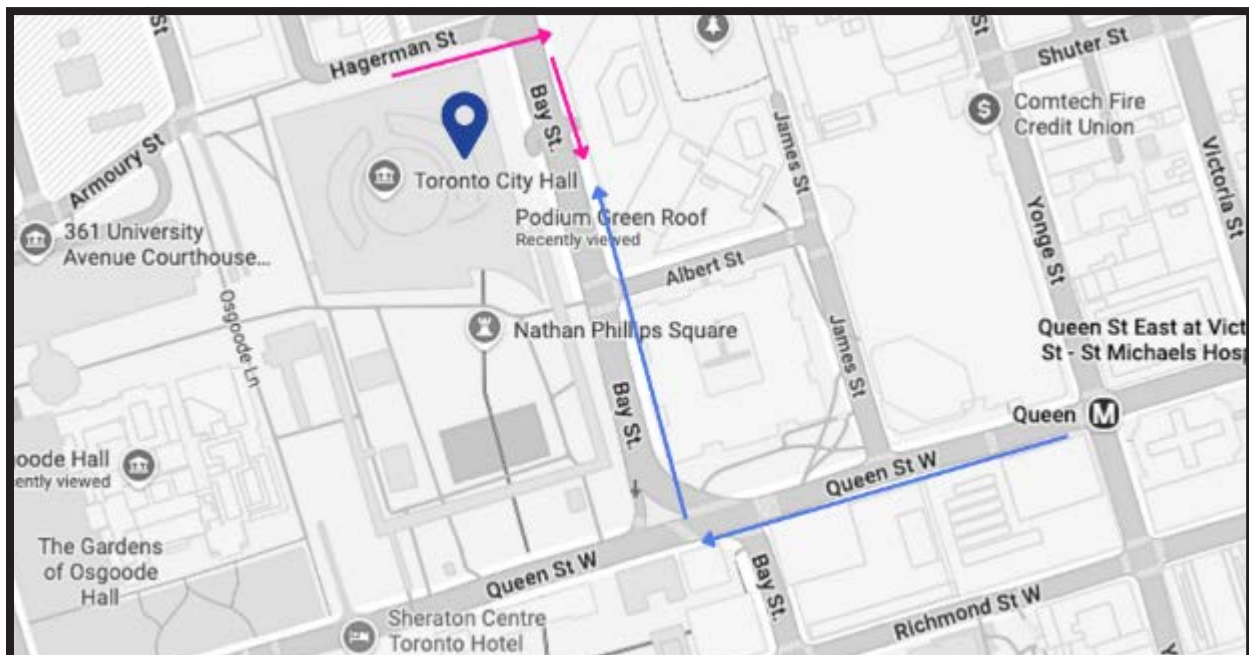
Hiba Abdallah - *Everything I Wanted To Tell You*

Originally presented during Nuit Blanche in Scarborough in 2018, *Everything I Wanted to Tell You* returns in 2026. The text installation transforms Toronto City Hall's East Tower into a living archive of hidden histories, personal memories and community voices—revealing the stories that shape Scarborough beyond official narratives.

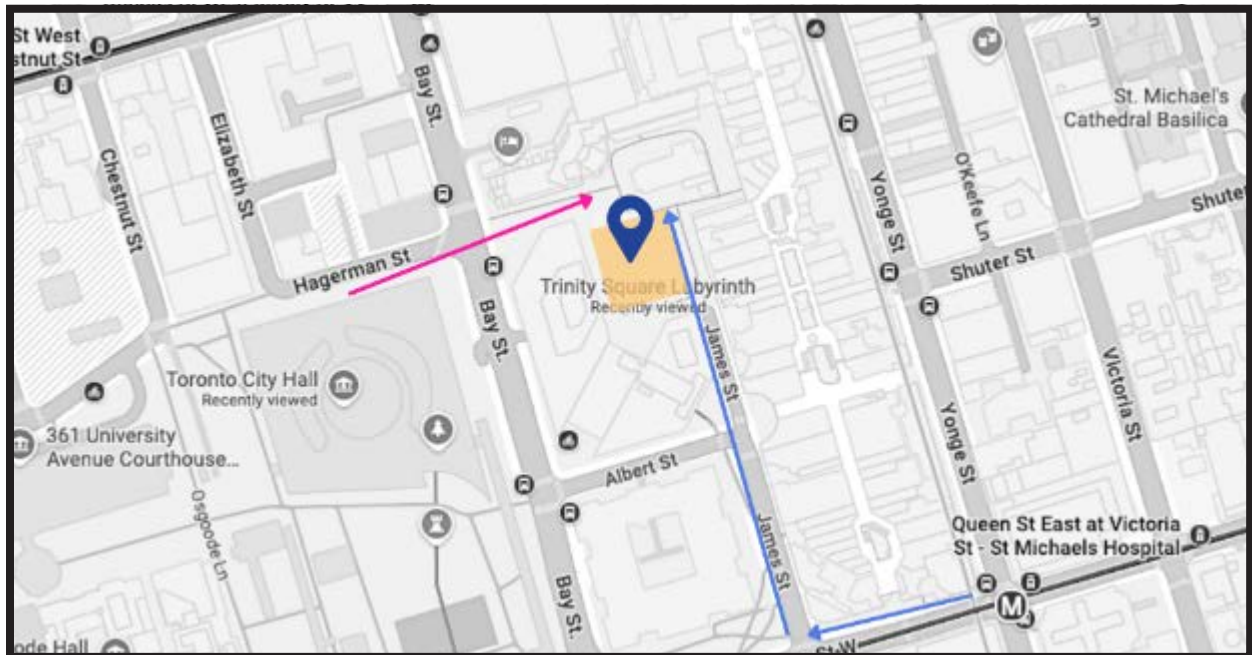
SJ Okemow - *Ever Sick*

Ever Sick is an interactive space that celebrates and expands the healing jingle dress tradition, with and for the disabled community. The work is a projected interactive installation that creates a space inclusive of dancers with disabilities, chronic disease and invisible illnesses.

Brandy Leary - *colour/LINE I public/body*

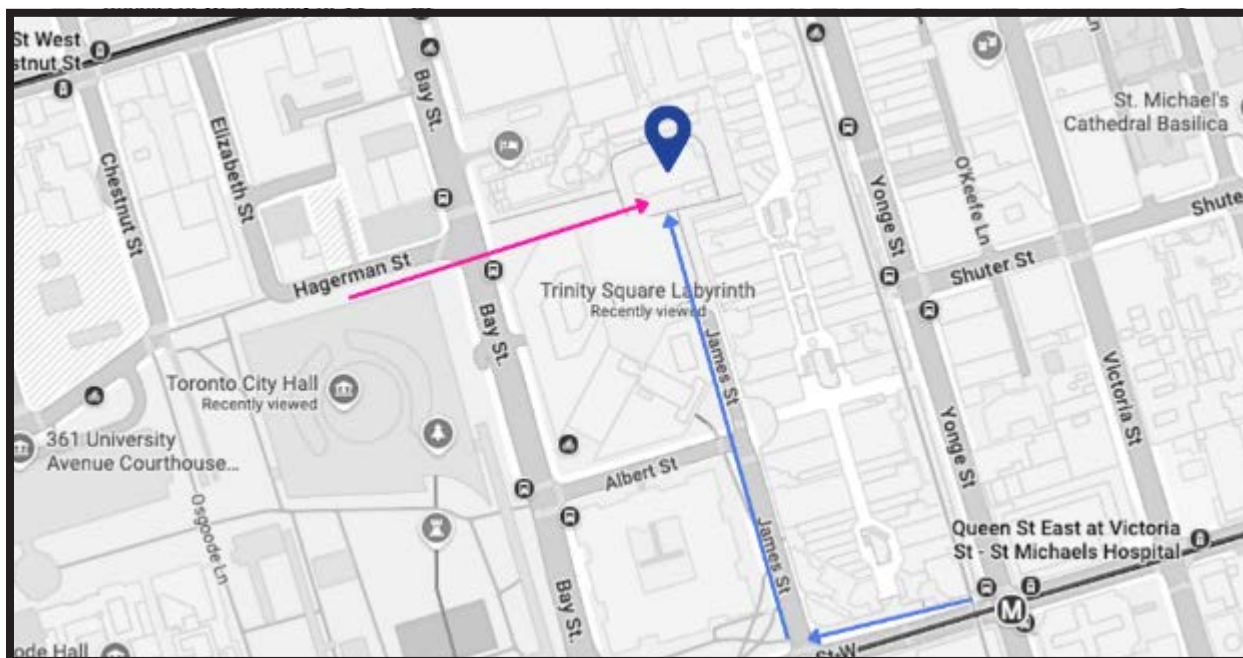
colour/LINE I public/body transforms public space into an immersive environment of large-scale video, sound, light and live movement. Audiences are invited to participate through guided non-verbal instruction with simple movement prompts, creating a living collage of projected and public bodies within a quiet, dreamlike atmosphere inspired by the fleeting encounters of Nuit Blanche.

[elephants] collective - *The Evening News / large craft warnings*

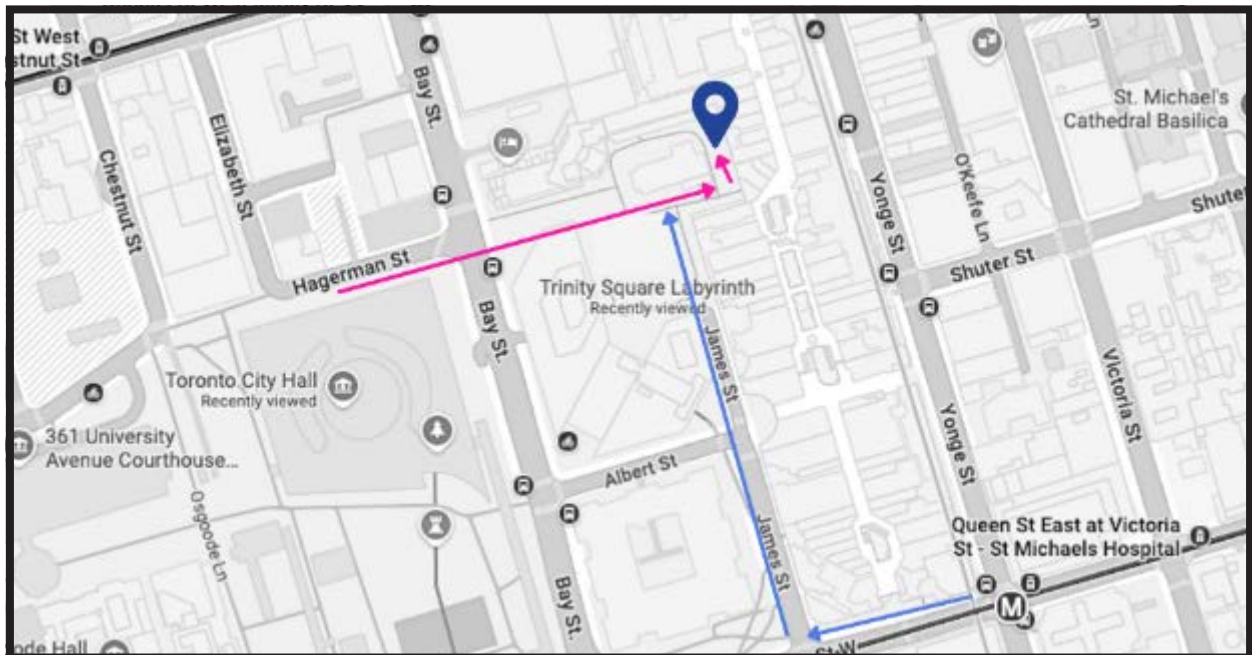
A speculative radio and live theatrical performance set in a DIY radio station one year in the future (October 3, 2027), in a world where the sky is falling. Presented in a freestanding structure in public space, this durational project can be experienced live as performance or everywhere else as a live-streamed radio broadcast.

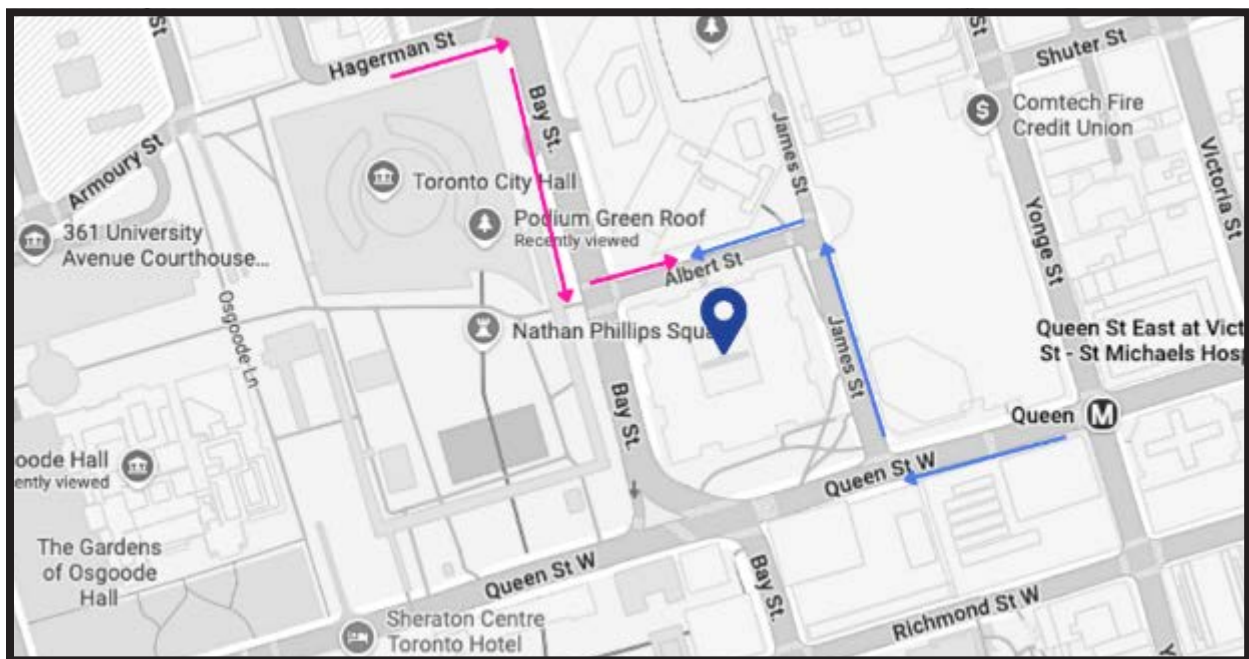

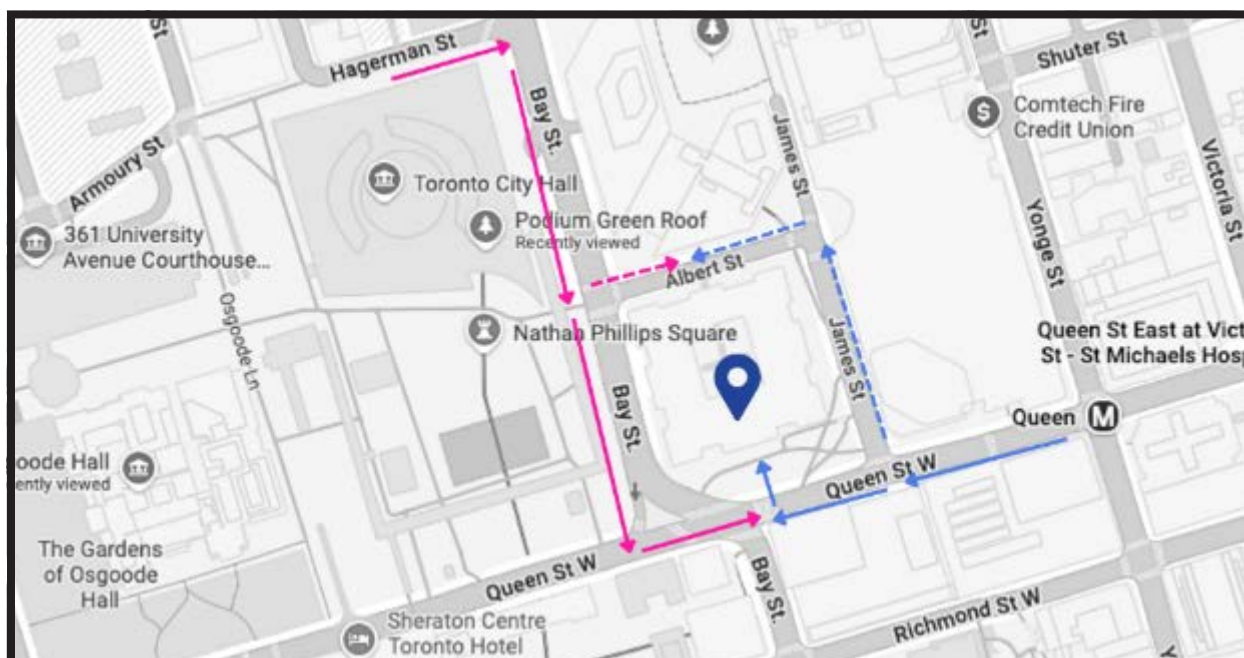

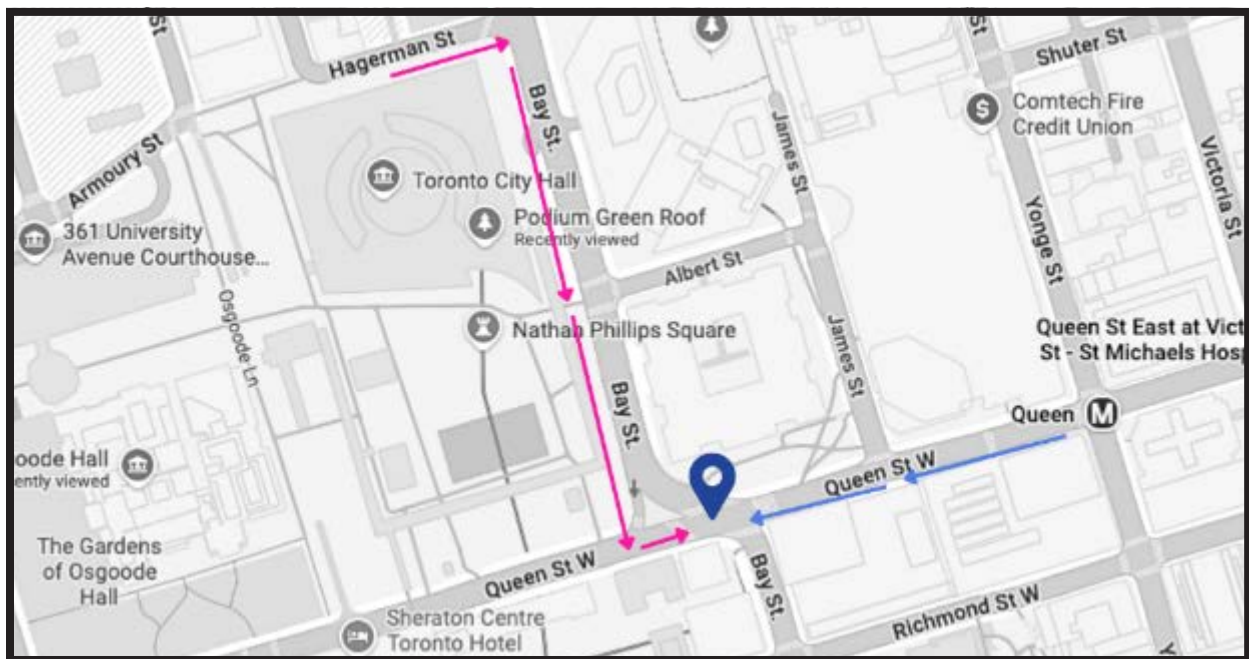

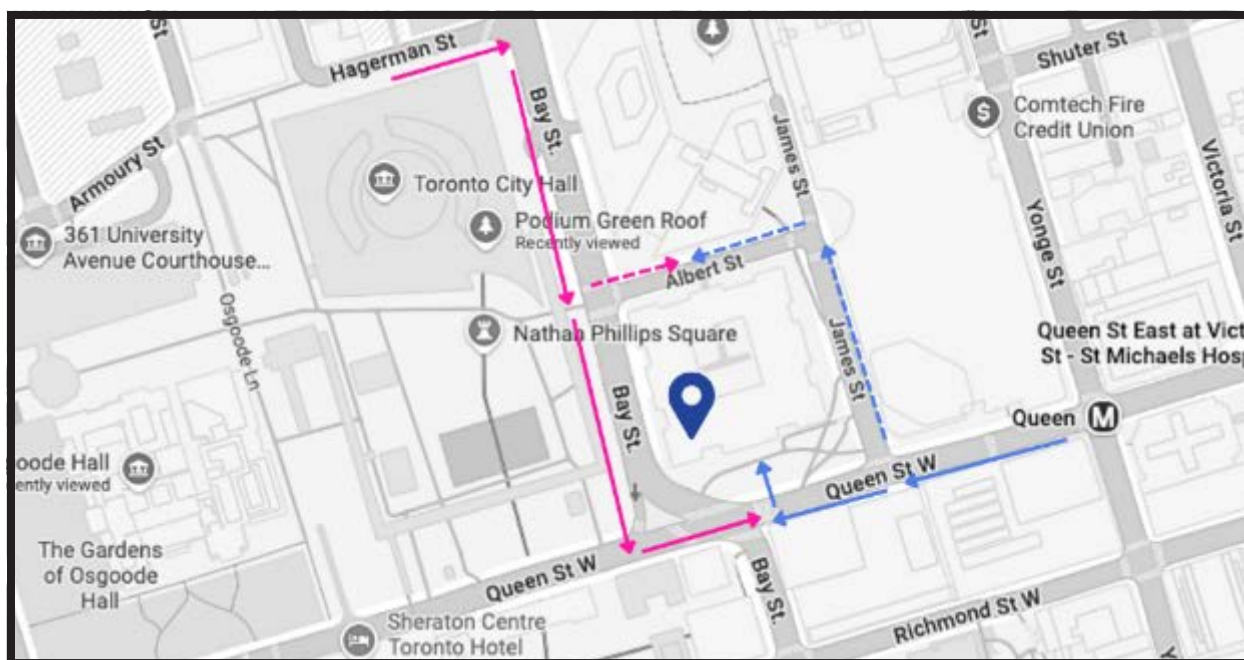

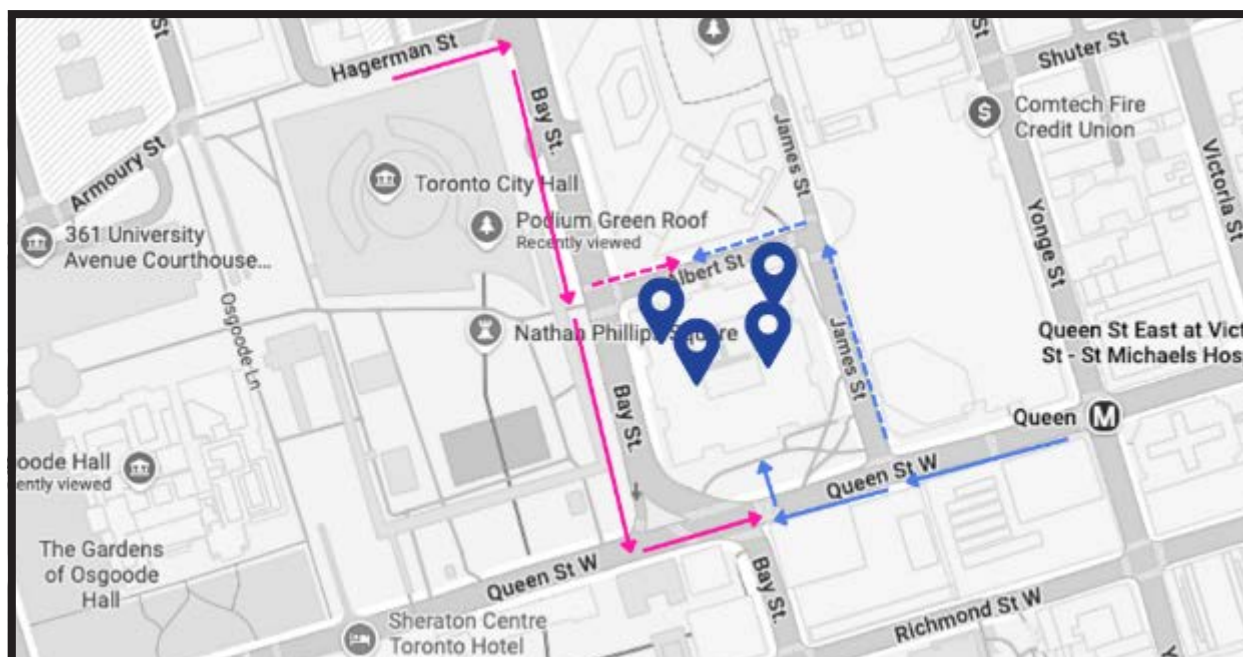
Maggy Hamel-Metsos - *Simile Aria*
