

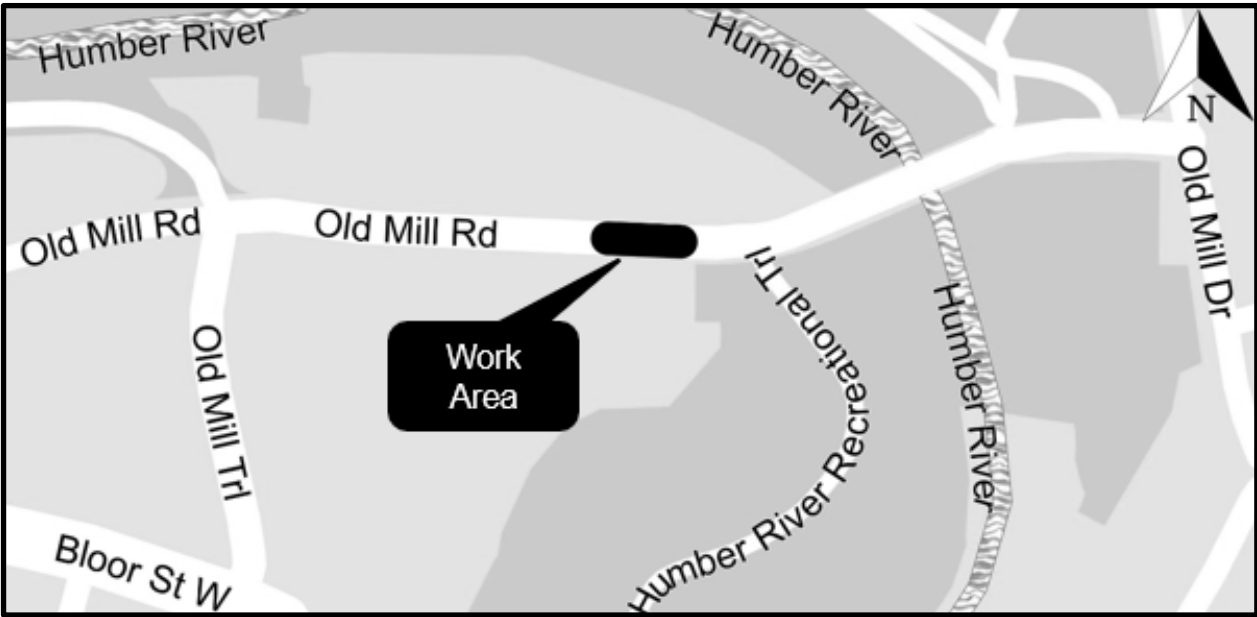

Old Mill Road Bridge Rehabilitation over Pedestrian Crossing

Contract: 26ECS-BE-01PM
Start Date: Fall 2026 End Date: Winter 2026/2027

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate the Old Mill Road Bridge over Pedestrian Crossing. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today’s standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2026 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS

- The City’s contractor will:
- Repair and refurbish the existing Old Mill Road Bridge over Pedestrian Crossing;
 - Patch repair the concrete deck, curbs, soffit and fascia;
 - Reface abutment walls, wingwalls, and toe walls;
 - Replace the asphalt surface and waterproofing.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Pre-Construction Inspection: The City-hired contractor will conduct inspections of properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment for the inspection. The inspection will look at the exterior and interior of properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all property owners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.

	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Temporary signage will guide pedestrians along the designated detour route around the bridge. The sidewalk north of Old Mill Road bridge will remain open at all times. A pedestrian path will be maintained through the work zone below the bridge throughout construction.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. The bridge will be closed to all traffic on Old Mill Road for twenty (20) days during waterproofing of the bridge deck. Signage will be posted at the work site in advance of the work. During the work on top of the bridge, road users travelling along Old Mill Road will be detoured via Old Mill Trail, Bloor Street West, Riverside Drive, and Old Mill Drive
	On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
