

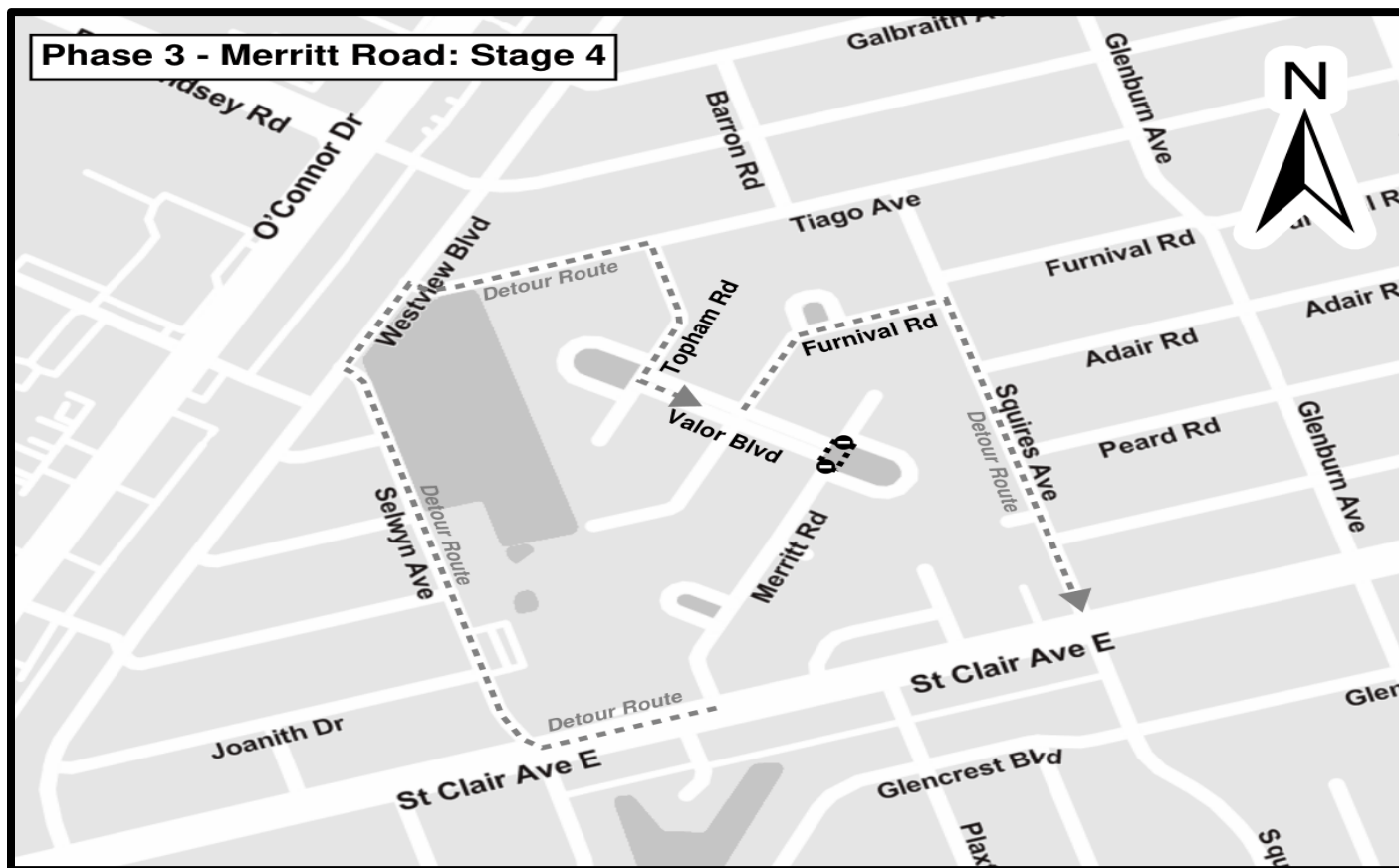

Storm Sewer Upgrade on Merritt Road

Contract: 23ECS-LU-03FP
 Phase 3 - Stage 4
 Start Date: September 8, 2026
 Expected End Date: September 11th, 2026
 *Dates subject to change

The City of Toronto is upgrading the storm sewer system along Merritt Road to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the construction work, a portion of Merritt Road will be closed during this stage of construction. The road closure will be in effect from 7 a.m., Tuesday, September 8, 2026, until 7 p.m., Friday, September 11, 2026. Please note, these dates are approximate and could change based on weather or scheduling factors.

WORK DETAILS

The contractor will:

- Remove the existing storm sewer to install new and larger storm sewers.
- **46 Merritt Road and 48 Merritt Road** are located within the Merritt Road stage 4 work zone and will be directly impacted by construction.
- The work area will be closed to all through traffic.
- Local road access and driveway access will be made available to residents within the work zone after 7 p.m. each workday. However, for residents living at the addresses listed above, the area will be closed during the construction dates listed due to excavation and residents will not have road or driveway access for the duration of the listed construction date.
- During construction, driveways may be impacted for varying periods of time. If a driveway closure is required, the contractor will distribute Driveway Impact Notices to the affected addresses when necessary.
- When driveway access is affected, please park in a legal spot on a **local side street** and display the Driveway Impact Notice on your windshield.

	Traffic Management: The work area will be closed to through traffic for the duration of construction. Please use the posted detour routes in place.
	Pedestrians: Sidewalks will be fully accessible on one side of the road.
	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with weekend work as required.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
	Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you always park in a legal parking spot.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:

1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) **or**
2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction.

If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.

Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e., in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).

To reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
