Intersection Improvements and Road Resurfacing at Deauville Lane and St. Dennis Drive

The City of Toronto recently completed reconstruction work at the intersection of Deauville Lane and Grenoble Drive as part of planned intersection safety improvements in the Flemingdon Park Area.

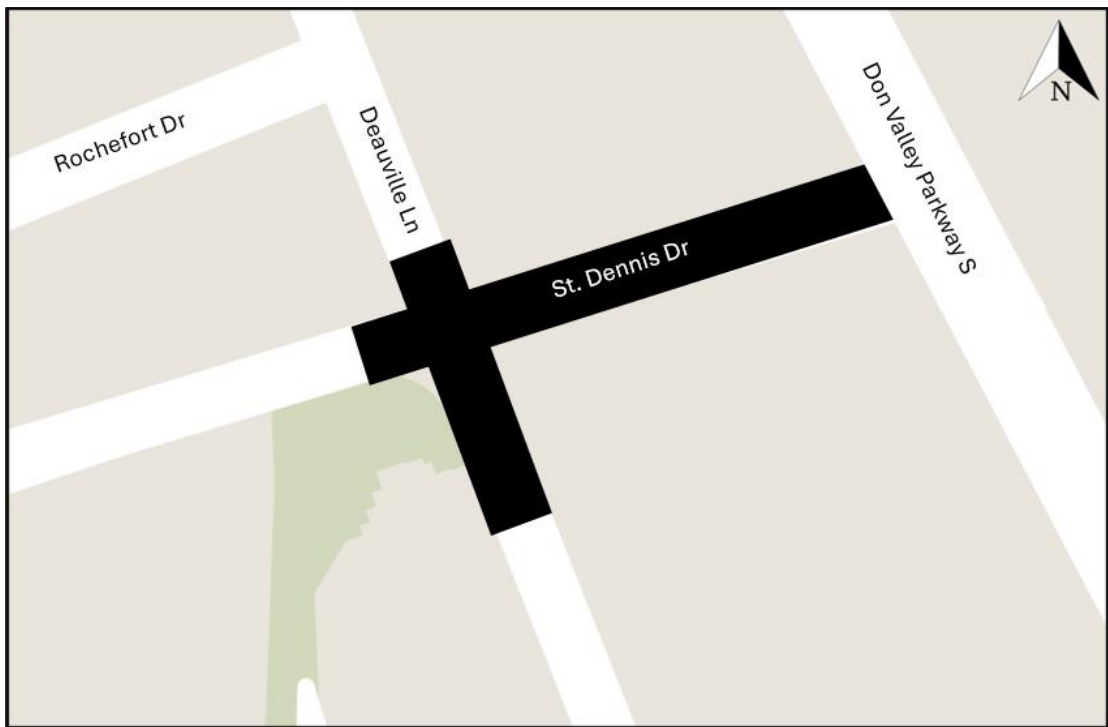
Starting in October 2026, the City is planning to reconstruct the intersection at Deauville Lane and St. Dennis Drive. As part of the upcoming work, the City will be making changes to the design of the intersection to increase safety and accessibility. There are no changes to the number of vehicle lanes. Intersection safety changes include:

- Widening sidewalks and increasing green space with trees, plantings and places to sit
- Reducing crossing distances for pedestrians
- Removing the right-turn channel on the corner in front of the Dennis R. Timbrell Resource Centre to improve safety and accessibility for pedestrians
- Upgrading and extending the existing painted bike lanes to raised cycle tracks into the intersection
- Adding pedestrian and bike head start, and No Right Turn on Red signage to improve safety for vulnerable road users

This work is part of the Council-approved 2026 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs. The most cost-effective time to make safety improvements is when we are already renewing aging roads.

The [Vision Zero Road Safety Plan](#) calls for engineering improvements where they are most needed to protect vulnerable users of our transportation system – people walking, children, seniors and people cycling.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.

- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the us at the information listed below.
	Traffic Management: Efforts will be made to manage traffic and closures in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets during this project.
