ROAD IMPACTS

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. **Restoration work is scheduled to take place between 7:00 A.M. on September 8, 2026, to 7:00 P.M. on September 18, 2026.**

If access to your driveway will be affected, a separate Driveway Access Impact Notice will be delivered at least 48 hours in advance, with impact dates included.

WORK DETAILS

- The contractor will:
- Reconstruct and restore the roadway on Shendale Drive which was **impacted by recent Basement Flooding Protection Program upgrades.**
 - Remove Tree Protection Fencing on Shendale Drive.
 - Restore sod and impacted driveways to pre-existing condition.
 - Allocate space on Shendale Drive for material storage during construction.

Reconstruction of the roadway will require the temporary **rolling road closure** of Shendale Drive, during this time Shendale Drive will be closed to through traffic.
Local and emergency access will be maintained.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours: Work will take place during the weekday from 7 A.M. to 7 P.M.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users, and residents. Traffic Detour during Road Restoration: • Shendale Drive will experience rolling road closure to all through traffic. Rolling closure will begin East of Norfield Crescent, and travel West along Shendale Drive, to North of Deeside Court. • Traffic can exit east, to Albion Road via Shendale Drive, and north to Islington Avenue through Golfdown Drive, via Cove Drive.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Driveway Access: During restoration, residents will have access to their driveways except when construction is occurring in front of their property. Driveway Impact Notices will be distributed on an ongoing basis as necessary. When driveway access is not available, please park in a legal spot on a local side street and display the Driveway Impact Notice in your windshield.
	Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions, however any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
